On the Way to the Forum, What Happened to "The League"?

The League of Women Voters has a reputation for running fair and unbiased candidates' forums in Beverly Hills and throughout the country; our decision to withdraw as the sponsor (and organizer) of the January 17 forum was not easily reached.

First, there was a disagreement about the timing of the program – we withdrew on January 5, feeling that we were not in control of the forum. By Monday, January 8, the League was again participating. On Wednesday, January 10, a member of the elections ad hoc committee [comprised of Councilmembers Barry Brucker and Linda Briskman] informed us "good news – we have gotten a professional moderator." We had told the committee weeks before who our moderator would be – a very qualified, experienced League member; they were discourteous in not even discussing their apparent need of

having a non-League moderator.

When the city council's elections ad hoc committee informed the League of the conditions being imposed on its historically independent forum, we felt we could not be a party to this scenario and regretfully withdrew our sponsorship on Friday, January 12.

The League looks forward to a return to independent forums without the interference and intervention of the city council's elections ad hoc committee.

Widening Santa Monica

The Beverly Hills North Homeowners Association has serious concern regarding the proposed widening of North Santa Monica Blvd between Wilshire Blvd and Doheny Drive.

Substantively, we believe that the plan to widen North Santa Monica Blvd into Beverly Gardens Park is a misbegotten adventure that will not only increase existing traffic and diminish precious existing parkland, but also will devalue the integrity of our residential neighborhoods, particularly in the 500 blocks immediately north of the proposed expansion.

Procedurally, we are also concerned that this matter denied our residents the rudiments of respected due process. Prior to the December 19, 2006 Memorandum of Understanding agreement entered into

between the City of Beverly Hills and the L.A. County Metropolitan Transportation Authority for the design and construction for the widening of North Santa Monica Blvd, between Wilshire Blvd and Doheny Drive, at no time were the Beverly Hills residents living in close proximity to the 500 blocks north of Santa Monica Blvd ever directly notified that this transaction was occurring. Accordingly, in our judgment, they were denied a fair opportunity to be heard.

We do not believe that government, particularly the Beverly Hills City Council, ought to act arbitrarily and/or by fiat. Such arrogance and dismissive disregard evinced by councilmember's Steve Webb and Jim Delshad for legitimate residential concerns oftentimes results in reasonable and understandable distrust of elected officials and bureaucratic officers.

We are hopeful that the Beverly Hills City Council and the L.A. County Metropolitan Transportation Authority will reconsider their actions and provide, at the very least, public forums for our residents directly affected by this proposal. Such public forums ought to permit and encourage meaningful public/resident participation at a meaningful time and place. To do otherwise, would further undermine the already eroding confidence many have in some of our elected officials

Final Forums Highlight Difference Among Candidates

Candidates clash over the industrial area and how to curb traffic; they join in plea for resident participation in the new general plan.

Fielding questions from a retailer, a hotel executive and a restaurant owner, the six city council candidates addressed issues pertinent to the business community on Monday, at the third and final city-sponsored candidate forum at City Hall.

Hosted by the Beverly Hills Chamber of Commerce and moderated by Anita Zusman Eddy, Director of Development and Governmental Affairs of the Chamber, the forum differed from previous forums in that the candidates were provided with the questions prior to the event.

"We distributed the questions to each of the candidates because the questions are complex and multifaceted," Zusman Eddy said.

The forum broached topics such as the need to enhance night life in the city in order to capture more tax revenues from evening shoppers and diners.

"Many people say that Beverly Hills is a 'day-time town' and that the 'streets of Beverly Hills roll up' after 5 or 6 p.m.," said panel member

Seth Horowitz, General Manager of the Luxe Hotel.

All candidates agreed that nighttime entertainment needs some kind of a boost, with Maggie Soleimani, Vice Mayor Jimmy Delshad, Mayor Steve Webb and Shahram Melamed all mentioning an interest to bring a jazz club to the business triangle.

But Webb threw the question back at the Chamber, stating the need for businesses to stay open later, especially during the holiday season.

"I put the onus on the Chamber and the business community during the holiday season because we cannot attract people here if the stores won't open," Webb said.

Melamed said the answer is in incentives for businesses.

"Why are we no incentivizing local businesses to stay open late, bring new businesses in [and] bring excitement? For example, a restaurant on Bedford can serve lunch to residents and turn into a jazz club at night, it won't bother neighbors," Melamed said.

The panel later brought up the controversial industrial area, which some insist must be used for municipal services, while others see it as an opportunity to attract new businesses.

Horowitz said that "many believe" that the industrial area and the eastern end of Wilshire Boulevard "don't look like the world class urban village that we all think Beverly Hills represents."

Nancy Krasne restated her adamant stance that the industrial area must be hands off to new business.

"Developing the industrial area would be the biggest catastrophic disaster other than a major earthquake that would hit this city," Krasne said. "Absolutely the industrial area should not be touched, these lands are for municipal services and we need the land to sustain any future growth in infrastructure."

Webb, who has long been an advocate of putting a sports and recreation facility on that land, disagreed.

"With all do respect to Ms. Krasne's doom and gloom theory, the idea of putting a water reclamation facility there at a cost of \$200 million - which we have firm numbers on from contractors - is not something this city is going to do," Webb said. "We have five and a half acres of land in this industrial area that is sitting vacant. I do think that we need to explore reasonable options."

Soleimani and Lizza Monet Morales also stated a need to preserve the area for municipal services. Melamed, citing two previous instances in which the community already voted to preserve the area for municipal uses, said that if necessary, the issue should again go back to a vote.

Webb and Delshad also suggested that the

future of the industrial area should ultimately be decided by the voters.

Prompted by a question about the future of Beverly Hills from panel member Catherine An, who owns Crustacean restaurant with her family, the candidates revisited one of the most critical defining issues of the election: the work-in-progress new general plan.

All the candidates, at one point or another during this election season, have indicated that a strict height limit should not be unconditionally mandated by the new general plan. Certain projects merit exceptions to the rule, the concept goes, and projects are better off evaluated on an individual basis.

But Soleimani bucked that trend on Monday, asserting herself as the only candidate that supports strict height limits.

"The new general plan must eliminate uncertainties and once adopted, we must stick on our rules on height and density," she said.

The proposed new general plan has been in the works for four years and there is no cemented timeline for its completion.

Krasne, a current planning commissioner, has indicated that it could still be far from complete.

"I'm opposed to the general plan as it is right now and I'm voting no on it," Krasne said at the first candidate forum at City Hall.

Melamed, who is the vice chair of the planning commission, has also been critical of the general plan as it stands.

"I am sad to say that [the new general plan] is being formed in the image of the current city council," Melamed said.

At the very least, all the candidates have agreed on one tenant of the new general plan - that it must include resident perspective and ultimately go to a vote of the people.

December Beverly Hills home prices down in 90210 and 90211 areas; condo prices up in 90210

December 2006 sale prices for single-family residences in the 90210 area decreased by 7.3% on 10 homes from December 2005 statistics, according to a report published by Data Quick Real Estate News (www.dqnews.com). In the 90211 area, prices are down 16.4% on 2 homes and in the 90212 area the price is up 14.7% on 1 home.

Condominium prices in the 90210 increased on six condos by 41.1%; decreased on two condos in the 90212 by 15.7%; and decreased by 7.1% on one condo in the 90212 area.

The median price for single family residences in the 90210 areas is \$1.9 million; \$1.15 million in 90211; and \$2.125 million in 90212.

The median price for condominiums in the 90210 area is \$1.013 million; \$641,000 in 90212; and \$1.365 million in 90211.

In Los Angeles County as a whole, sales of single family homes are up 5.8% with a median price of \$550,000. Condominium prices are up 3% with a median price of \$412,000

Climate Protection Agreement Endorsed by Beverly Hills

The city council reached a consensus on Tuesday that will allow Mayor Steve Webb to sign the United States Conference of

Mayors Climate Protection Agreement.

Based on findings from the Inter-Governmental Panel on Climate Change and the Kyoto Protocol, the Climate Protection Agreement was originally introduced at the 73rd session of the Conference of Mayors in 2005. In signing the agreement, Mayor Webb joined 393 mayors nationwide who have already endorsed this call to action.

The Climate Protection Agreement urges Federal and State governments to enact policies and programs to reduce global warming. A number of local initiatives outlined in the agreement for municipalities include practicing and promoting sustainable "green" building, increasing recycling rates, seeking transit alternatives and developing land-use policies

that preserve open-space.

"The timeliness of this issue cannot be lost given the recent United Nations report that global warming is no longer considered a fiction or a myth, it is a certainty," Webb said. "On behalf of the entire City Council, we are in unanimous support that Beverly Hills join in the effort to decrease greenhouse gases and become an environmentally sustainable City."

Beverly Vista Playground Squeezed by Construction

A northern parcel of the Beverly Vista playground along Elm Drive will function as a temporary parking lot as construction of the B-building progresses, according to Beverly Vista Principal Erik Warren.

As the B-building expands, the campus has had to make new parking accommodations for construction vehicles. The lot - which is separated from the rest of the playground by a chain-link fence - will be reconverted to playground space in July, Warren said.

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

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Star Chamber? Not Quite

Insider Words Around the Village

As God is my witness, and how often do you see a reference to the deity in this column, I had no idea the Beverly Hills Chamber of Commerce had “an official wine.”

This may explain all those joyful meetings in the board room.

What made me aware of this vintage endorsement, and don't expect me to plug the product here, is the very slick annual magazine the Chamber distributes through the assistance of professional publishers and marketers.

For some years the Chamber has used this tool as both a fundraiser and in promoting and advertising businesses, not all in our city. Of the sixteen hotels in the magazine's listing, six are out of our city and pay no bed (TOT) or other taxes to Beverly Hills. Also, because they are not a member, the Peninsula is not even listed although it is clearly our leading hotel and supplies some eager shoppers to our business area.

Remember, the city funds much of the Chamber's tourism promotion through the TOT.

It could reasonably be argued that city funds should not be used to promote competing businesses, even though they are Chamber members. The counter argument is that these hotels also do bring us shoppers, but not the bed tax.

Now, I have the highest regard for the Chamber, even though I sometimes find myself in a minority at their Government Affairs Committee meetings.

Hey, if they want to dig a hole under Wilshire Boulevard in twenty years, maybe the then manager of Neiman Marcus will love it and the vacation down time he or she is likely to enjoy.

This Chamber has, in **Dan Walsh**, probably the best CEO in its history, so it is hard, painful even, to find fault with an organization with such fine leadership and so many dedicated board members. But I'll try.

Take the magazine, please. There are limits on the advertising dollars merchants spend – they do have budgets. Checking their primary ads, the big color, full page offerings, I found few that ever advertise in our community papers. Now, the Chamber and the community depend on the local press to communicate and those publications only survive with advertising. The Chamber also wants good relations with the press, at least they seem to, but here they are doing a competitive number. I should add, as a disclaimer, I have no economic interest in this publication and, as far as I know, none in the Courier, and I think I would know. Just suppose, the papers decide to organize their own business association and compete with the Chamber?

Under Walsh's leadership, the Chamber's press relations have improved, but there are still issues that have a history.

One of the more successful adjuncts to the Chamber is an economic affiliation that holds monthly meetings and programs. Now, the Chamber craves publicity, for which newspapers are expected to donate free space, when it is truly news, and yet the community press is not invited, except rarely. Not good pr, not good government – and the Chamber is quasi government.

Once, when **March Schwartz** still ran the Courier, he had a running battle with the

Chamber and froze out all their news. Part of the problems was a suggestion by Schwartz on a hiring policy. They balked, he walked.

Some years later, a more insightful Chamber president appointed Schwartz to the board of directors, and peace reigned. At least for two years. Then a new president asked the wrong question: “March, do you still want to be on the board,” and Schwartz retreated back to 8840 and Finney's, insulted by the inference, I suppose.

Aside from Walsh, some top staff people, including the great professional that handles calls and visitors to the office, the Chamber board is loaded with talent and creative leadership.

So, how explain their inability to deliver even a token audience for their city council candidate's forum? This lack of response to city events, except those that are directly related to business and networking is puzzling. The Chamber can throw an economic summit, a state of the city event, and pack the room.

But mobilizing Chamber leaders and members to a city council hearing on a proposal the Chamber strongly supports, never happens.

It didn't happen last Tuesday either when our Chamber sponsored the last candidate's forum, probably one of the most interesting. You could count the members and officers present on one hand, even if your paw was missing a couple of digits.

There were more members of candidates' families than Chamber directors. Now, if you want to be a player, how do you think

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the Chamber fares in the minds of city leaders looking out at all those empty seats when the Beverly Hills North Homeowner's Association packed a larger room at Roxbury Park for their candidate's forum? (The Chamber forum, and two others, were held at city hall and will and are being televised.)

The Chamber panel, obviously, focused on business related questions and they were to the point. Three business leaders were questioners, the candidates were given the questions just before the meeting and a Chamber staff member, not Walsh, served as moderator. The moderating didn't go well. At least one candidate complained about timekeeping, and none were introduced before each response to questions, just started talking in turn.

Speaking of the election, and by now you should have your absentee ballots, the lawn signs have arrived. It is never wise to assume vote counts or leads in elections by numbers of signs – in the last election one of the losers had the most. But they do tell a story. At least three homeowners have complained that signs were planted without permission. Not a cool way to insure a vote.

Mostly, this has been a clean campaign – at least the public part. Some of the innuendos and personal attacks have not been.

Although I strongly (is there any other way to have an opinion in Beverly Hills) oppose the widening of Santa Monica Boulevard, as far as I can discover, there are no "secret" agreements to make that happen. The council needs to be far more open though on the process. The reasons for even

acquiring the street from the state unless it was to widen the boulevard, needs airing. In retrospect, we may have been given a fruit cake gift.

The same is true of a charge that the council and the Hilton have a "memorandum of understanding" on their new building plans. A councilmember who is not pro-growth and is not a candidate in the election insisted no such agreement exists. In any case, the Hilton proposal merits a fair hearing process if for no other reason than because of their historic contributions to our city, including the considerable charitable support provided by the new owner, Beny Alagem. Am I ready to support high rise towers? Not quite yet, but I must admit the idea of making a section of the hotel a Waldorf Astoria is intriguing.

Incidentally, talking about improving marketing, the very best attention the city receives each year is the telecasting of the Golden Globes, from the Hilton. The hotel also hosts the Academy Award nominations.

Our indefatigable reporter, **Ryan Vaillancourt**, culled a number of incredible wacky quotes from the candidate forums - none of the contenders were immune from fist in mouth phenomena - but Ryan began the chore to confirm a quote in this column one of the candidates had recently challenged. I was right, but in fairness and just for fun, not malice, we may run some other samples next week. One candidate needs some anger management, others need some of his passion. Strike a happy medium here. (If you can't find a cheerful medium, whack a soothsayer.)

Endorsements, and most candidates want all they can solicit, can raise questions. One candidate has the backing of both CTR, the renters, and the board of realtors group, and one of their members wondered about that. Also, CTR may be backing three candidates, not two, reminiscent of the late, wonderful **Sybil Brand** who never met a candidate she refused to support.

In any case, **Lizza Monet Morales**, claims that endorsement.

Historical note: I have been around long enough to remember when a "Jewish" candidate had little chance of winning any election in our city, when the Beverly Hills Bar Association had a leadership quota system and when there were restrictive covenants in much of the flats. Hopefully, we will not retreat to ethnicity as a qualification either for or against public service. If we haven't learned to judge people on their merits, who ever will?

Some very few voters have questioned why their ballots have a Farsi language version. It is the law and is done where a significant number of voters may read a language other than English. Our Persian voters did not request this; the ballot format is created by the City Clerk. In West Hollywood, they include Russian on the ballot.

But to assume there is a slate of Persian and non-Persian candidates is ludicrous. The three non-Iranian candidates disagree on almost every issue as do the Iranian contenders. In fact, the differences between

those three is probably even sharper, both personally and politically.

Of all the cities in the world, I would never believe that Beverly Hills would ever make religion, race or ethnicity instead of issues and qualification a deciding factor or reason for voting.

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BHHS Girls' Soccer Team Shuts Out Inglewood Again

Norman boys' soccer team defeats Hawthorne

The Beverly High girls' soccer team began the second round of Ocean League play just like the first with a shutout victory over Inglewood.

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
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

WILL ROGERS WANTS YOU.....!

(TO RUN FOR THE BOARD OF EDUCATION)

Our first of two election editorials.

In three weeks, we will offer our recommendations for the upcoming city council election. But today, we offer a plea for something that's still five months away.

As many of our readers know, Will Rogers, Beverly Hills' first honorary mayor, was a popular humorist of the 1920s and early 1930s. In his popular newspaper column, Rogers often wrote satirical observations about government and the need for greater civic participation.

So what would Will think if one day we held an election, and nobody showed up? Unfortunately for all of us, that has already happened.

What a tragedy it was for democracy when, in 2005, nobody filed to run for the Board of Education. Two candidates were then automatically elected by default.

Cancelled elections are always a bad idea. We felt the same way when, in 1999, the City Council election was cancelled due to a lack of candidates.

We're determined to help make sure this type of apathy never happens again.

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
