Council Race: Krasne in first place, Delshad in second

With final result pending, city council election's outcome to be determined Friday

Nancy Krasne leads the Beverly Hills City Council election, with final winners not to be determined until Friday after the remaining provisional and absentee ballots will be counted.

Krasne leads with 2486 votes, Vice Mayor Jimmy Delshad 2192, followed narrowly by Mayor Steve Webb with 2185. Maggie Soleimani had 1954 votes, Shahram Melamed received 1040 and

Lizza Morales claimed 324.

"I don't know what the outcome will be," Krasne said. "If I don't (win), I will support whoever wins, whoever sits up there, because that's the voice of the community."

Webb's reaction was similar.

"The outcome is far from final," Webb said. "We're just going to have to wait until Friday afternoon."

As of Wednesday morning, Webb wasn't sure if he'd hire an attorney to supervise the count.

"It depends on the result and if the entire election process continues to be run prop-

erly," Webb said.

Unofficial results are 5,701 ballots cast with 892 provisionals outstanding.

Fredric Woocher, an election law attorney, said if someone for example, tried to challenge the voter registration based on citizenship, their attempt would likely be unsuccessful.

"It would be very difficult to prove that an issue has been raised," Woocher said about making sure that only citizens are registering. "It used to be an issue (but) the registration laws have tightened up and voters have to show forms of I.D. like driver's license and social security card number."

He said such a process would be lengthy and difficult because they have to get the person on a witness stand to prove they actually did go to a poll and vote.

Robin Chancellor, Director of Communications for the City of Beverly Hills, said all the absentee ballots that were received no later than Tuesday and the provisional ballots are being verified as the winners will officially be announced late Friday afternoon.

As for some of the candidates' state of mind, Krasne is going to Italy over the weekend to relax and get out of the spot-

light, she said.

"I'm going to go clear my head and look at some great art. I'll walk the streets and nobody will know who I am. I'll be anonymous," Krasne said.

As for Webb, he's staying in town and feeling optimistic.

"I'm actually fine. 'I've received a lot of phone calls of good wishes,'" Webb said. "I can look back with pride win or lose."

Regardless of the outcome, Krasne said she wants what's best for the community.

"It doesn't matter who comes in first, second. What's important is this city comes together as one," Krasne said.

However, if elected, she will continue to carry on a tradition of representing the people and that will not change, she said.

"If I'm going to have the opportunity to sit on that desk as City Council member...my goal is to implement the issues that I ran on. I'm going to stick to my plan." Krasne said.



January 2007 Home Prices Down in 90210 and 90211.

January sale prices for single-family residences in Beverly Hills decreased in the 90210 area on 19 homes by 17.9% and decreased on three homes in the 90211 region by 15.1% from January 2006 statistics, according to a report published by Data Quick Real Estate News (www.dqnews.com). The percentage change was not available for the 90212 area.

The median price for single family residences in the 90210 area is \$1.899 million, \$1.200 million in the 90211 area and \$2.328 million for 90212.

Condominium prices in the 90210 decreased by 73.9% on two condos, increased on two condos in the 90211 area by 28.1% and increased on six condos in the 90212 area by 4.3%.

The median price for condominiums in the 90210 area is \$575,000, \$1.217 million for 90211 and \$621,000 for 90212.

In Los Angeles County as a whole, sales of single family homes are up 5.8% with a median price of \$545,000 and condominium prices are up 1.4% with a median of \$421,000.



Horace Mann students conduct walkathon for spinal cord research

Ten years ago Jesse Billauer became a quadriplegic when his spinal cord broke after he was thrown from his surfboard into a sandbar. What Happened In The Election?

If you thought it was over, not quite yet

The only thing we can write with any certainty is there was a Beverly Hills City Council election and there are two possible winners. In one of the most bizarre contests in Beverly Hills campaign history, the final results now rest with the counting of what are considered provisional ballots.

First, what we do know is that **Nancy Krasne** is a very likely winner and that Vice Mayor **Jimmy Delshad** is leading for the second spot, but not by sufficient votes to assure election. A record number of "provisional" ballots will be counted in the next few days with a probable conclusion next Monday. In a very strange twist, the contest now is between two incumbents, Mayor **Steve Webb** and Delshad with an outside chance for challenger **Maggie Soleimani** who was only 200 votes out of the winners' circle.

What are provisional ballots? These are ones accepted at the polling place but questioned for a number of possible reasons: Are they possible duplicates of absentee ballots?

Voters who came to the wrong polling place? And even voters who insisted they were legally registered but not on the county clerk's list. Those are the largest number, but there could also be ballots that were questioned by the voting machines for a variety of reasons including questionable markings.

City Clerk **Byron Pope** will verify these "provisionals" and then count or reject them. But here's where the fun begins: If the election is very close, the challenged ballots will be reexamined during a possible recount where they could be a cause for court tests, something that has been considered in one previous school board race in 1993 that initially had one candidate, **Michael Karlin**, ahead of **Jo Ann Koplín** by one vote. Koplín won the recount by four votes, but Karlin did not take the count to court.

A last minute flurry of attack pieces against Krasne probably assured her victory. A clumsy effort to label Krasne as "pro-growth" despite her backing by a homeowner associa-

tion that had fought developments such as the Montage Hotel and Gardens project, was quite bizarre. At this writing identification of the group responsible could not be determined, but it is very unlikely that it came from anti-growth groups or individuals.

What also dramatically changed the campaign was the design of the ballot by the city clerk and the inclusion of a larger than previous Farsi translation. This led to some angry phone calls and conflicting editorials in the Beverly Hills Courier (we don't need foreign languages) and the Los Angeles Times (nothing wrong with translations that help people understand the ballot) or some such arguments.

What was difficult to measure was the appeal candidates were making to cultural groups. Not one of the non-Persian candidates made an issue out of their opponents ethnic identifies. However, all three of the Persian candidates campaigned very hard for those votes. Delshad made much of his heritage, asking for votes because he would become the first Iranian in America to become a city's mayor. Actually, that honor fell to another community

The election even made the front page of the Wall Street Journal, a story that focused on Delshad's efforts to become the city's first Iranian mayor and on the ballot controversy.

The so-called experts were all predicting the Delshad would be in a close race with Krasne

for second place and that Webb would lead comfortably. However, in recent elections, being mayor has not been a ballot asset. Although winning comfortably, then Mayor **Linda Briskman** ran third in 2005 and two years earlier, then Mayor **MeraLee Goldman** lost a reelection to challenger Delshad. In the last 10 or 15 years other than mayors who lost reelections included **Robert K. Tanenbaum** and Annabelle Heiferman.

How important were issues in the campaign? Voters sent a mixed message. Krasne had the strong backing of the Beverly Hills North Homeowners who accused the council of being too supportive of developments, but at the same time probably chose one of two councilmembers the association targeted for defeat. The association also supported Soleimani who was running a close fourth. What probably most hurt Soleimani was the three hundred votes that went to Monet-Morales and to the other Iranian candidate and council critic **Shahram Melamed** who had a disappointing 1,040 votes, over 900 behind Soleimani.

Although there were three Iranian contenders, they were very competitive and made no effort to hide their differences. Totalling the votes of the Iranian and non-Iranian candidates showed some interesting results. Despite the Farsi ballot flare up, the combined votes of the three Iranian candidates totaled 5,189 to the non-Iranians 4,998, which probably means that there was considerable mixing and matching among voters from both communities.

Soleimani did extremely well in her own far north precinct and at El Rodeo where she is a key education leader and in many renter dis-

tricts.

If Delshad does edge Webb, it will be because of his strong, last minute get out the vote drive. When an election is this close, the run for number two, any small incident could have made a difference. Webb did have a minor run-in with a southwest resident that resulted in an email urging his defeat. Webb had responded to what he labeled an attack "on my integrity" by a southwest resident in an emotional, personal letter which the resident than made public. Webb may have also borne the brunt of many voters dislike of the loss of two hour free parking, but it was the intensity of the vigorous, high spending drive of Delshad that may have turned the election around. He did trail Webb in the absentees.

Next week, when the final results are finally made public, we will have a much clearer vision of the meaning of this election. However, there is very likely to be a mammoth sigh of relieve that it is over. The flurry of mailers, the programmed telephone calls, the inordinate attention to the ballot design and the harsh tone of the various attack pieces turned off many residents and may have been the reason a majority of voters simply stayed home.

Aside from the candidates, there were other losers in the election. Both community newspapers backed Webb and Delshad, with the Courier editorializing against Krasne. Most of the political establishment supported Webb and opposed Krasne and the repercussions could be felt in the next council race. This column, while making no endorsements, did give high ratings to Krasne, Webb and Soleimani. Sometimes endorsements really can't deliver votes. One of the popular leaders

in our city, at least when he served on the school board, was **Dr. Willie Brien**. But his backing of Melamed wasn't sufficient to make Shahram a serious challenger.

The candidates themselves stayed reasonably positive, but the community needs some breathing time, some closing of ranks. There are far more things that unite us than keep us apart, and we need some leadership to express that in the weeks ahead. As for changes in city government, those will not be very noticeable, at least at first. Krasne does have a mandate for change, but she will have to work with a majority that has differed on only a few issues in recent months.

We should be grateful to all the candidates for making the effort and for their willingness to serve. Someday, we may even convince a majority of residents to vote. Who knows what could happen then?

Pope did a good job in processing the election results, but there were problems at polling places and, during the campaign, issues on forums, designs of ballots and more that need to be reconsidered by this council before the next election. As for any possible candidates for 2009, if any announce within the next 30 days, I will personally campaign against them. Let's give it a rest.



"It shows Iranian parents the importance of involvement," Pirnia said. "It's a chance to give back to this wonderful American society."


But most importantly she added, the NowRuz Extravaganza is a chance for the children to be proud of their culture and to help educate others in a very uplifting way.




