North Rexford adopts new permit parking rules

Residents are relieved, but workers aren't By Amanda Parsons

North Rexford Drive residents turned out for Tuesday's council meeting to voice their need for increased parking restrictions in area G.

The unanimous resolution of the city council established preferential permit parking in Zone G with "No Parking Anytime, Except by Permit" on the 200 and 300 blocks of North Rexford Drive and Dayton Way from Rexford drive to the first alley to the east and includes it with the existing permit parking zone "G" on the 100 block of North Rexford Drive. a.m. to 6 p.m. Monday through Saturday" restrictions which run on the 100 block of North Rexford Drive, Elm, Maple and Palm. Clifton Way has "No Parking Anytime, Except by Permit" restrictions in place.

The only opposition to the increased parking restriction came from tenants of the building at 9301 Wilshire Boulevard.

Councilmember Linda Briskman reminded the City Council that the owner and tenants of the 9301 Wilshire Boulevard building are required by Municipal Code to provide free validated medical parking for patients, as a condition of converting the use of the

Councilmember Briskman and former Councilmember Steve Webb served on the Planning Commission when several public hearings were held on the conversion of office space to medical office space at 9301 Wilshire Boulevard back in the 1990's. Briskman reported there was no question that free validated parking was to be provided by the tenants, and that the owner is clearly not in compliance with that requirement, which could result in revoking their Conditional Use Permit. CUPs are needed in order for a business to occupy a building.

"We would need to investigate. We will ask code enforcement to investigate what is happening on that block and move on from there," Transportation Director Aaron Kunz said.

According to Kunz, the issue of parking concerns in zone G have been on going for years. A petition signed by more than 50% of the residences on the 100 block of North Rexford Drive was filed in 2003, followed by the residents on the 200 block of North Rexford and shortly there after the 300 block.

Nearly 95 percent of the 200 block residents and 69 percent of 300 block residents signed a petition to restrict parking on their block.

A major concern among residents is the on street parking by restaurant employees who work nearby. The complaints ranged from a *city and schools cont. on page 8*

AN ORDINANCE OF THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BEVERLY HILLS AMENDING THE COMPREHENSIVE SCHEDULE OF TAXES, FEES AND CHARGES TO ADJUST UTILITY RATES FOR FISCAL YEAR 2007/2008.

The proposed Ordinance will amend the City's current utility rates to increase the rates charged for water service, wastewater (sewer) service, and solid waste (refuse) service to offset additional operating and capital expenditures incurred by the City.

The City of Beverly Hills is proposing to increase utility rates later this year so that it can continue to provide reliable and high quality service in the face of rising costs. The increases include water, sewer, and solid waste utilities, and are necessary to maintain a high level of service, invest in maintenance and replacement of aging infrastructure, and maintain adequate reserves in case of emergency.

The City of Beverly Hills is proposing the increases because of rising construction, power, and fuel costs; to maintain the City's infrastructure; and to be prepared for emergencies such as earthquakes and their aftermath.

Costs continue to rise rapidly, including the amount the City pays for water from the Metropolitan Water District, fuel costs for trash trucks, and improvements in water and sewer lines to keep them safe and reliable

The rate increases are similar to those in nearby cities, and are based on the guidance of utility experts who have thoroughly researched the City's current and long-term needs Absorbing cost increases and deferring maintenance is not an option; the City is required to ensure that rates keep up with costs and that facilities are well-maintained and reliable

At the public hearing, the City Council will hear and consider all objections or protests to the proposed ordinance and report.

If the Council adopts the proposed ordinance, the new rates will become effective on bills prepared after Friday, July 20, 2007.

Mercer losing in Community College Board election

South Maple Drive resident Georgia Mercer narrowly lost re-election to the Los Angeles Community College Board according to the unofficial vote totals as of Wednesday morning.

Mercer lost to former police officer and teacher Roy Burns.

According to the unofficial totals, Burns beat Mercer by only 88 votes to win the election with 50.04 percent of the total vote: 58,359 to 58,271. The final numbers could change once all absentee ballots are counted.

Mercer could not be reached for comment.

Construction to begin at Coldwater Canyon Reservoir

The City of Beverly Hills and SEMA Construction, Inc. of Lake Forest, will begin construction on a \$22.5 million subterranean reservoir to replace the Coldwater Canyon Reservoir on May 14.

The new project is expected to add additional water capacity and a new park space. Park amenities will include a synthetic jogging track, seating areas with shade trellises, a fountain and water feature, new irrigation, landscaping and trees. The track that is currently in place at

Coldwater Canyon has been closed for years.

Construction is scheduled to last for approximately 32 months and will take place at the east side of Coldwater Canyon at the intersection of Beverly Drive.

The original subterranean reservoir, built in 1928, has undergone regular maintenance and repairs over the years. It now requires complete replacement due to the damage from both the 1971 Sylmar and 1994 Northridge earthquakes.

The incumbent councilman in the fifth, Jack Weiss, is "termed out" and is likely to seek election as Los Angeles City Attorney. He too has some Beverly Hills connections. His mother, Jacqueline, was a judge in our district, and his father, Walter, once ran for Beverly Hills City Council, losing to Dr. Charles Aronberg, Jake Stuchen and Richard Stone.

Talk radio has taken some hits recently. Two jocks back east had some horrendous and tasteless airing of suggested sex acts imposed on our secretary of state, **Condoleeza Rice**, that were neither funny or worthy of repetition. Freshman also contributed two autographed copies of his book, "Principles of Real Estate Investment." The event honored Freshman friend **Peter Lakey**.

I am not objective about the proposed ban on smoking in outdoor areas, as you probably know. In fact, I am, for a brief time only, the spokesperson for the newly formed Beverly Hills Restaurant Association which is fighting the ban.

What bothers me most about this seemingly well-intentioned proposed ban is that Beverly Hills is once again being used as a test tube experiment, much as we were when the animal rights extremists tried to force a label on all fur products sold in the city.

Yes, Santa Monica passed a ban, but since when have we used that city as a model of rational governing? Burbank and Calabasas have also bought into a variation of a ban. However, our city has far more significant reasons for not rushing into an experiment that could hurt city revenues: We are very heavily dependent on tourism and we spend enormous amounts to lure them to our hotels, stores and, yes, restaurants.

Now, no rational person can defend smoking. It kills and the risks of second

hand smoke are also a hazard to nonsmokes. But what is absolute nonsense are the possible dangers of smoke in outdoor areas.

In fact, a recent ABC 20/20 show listed outdoor second hand smoke dangers as one of the great "myths" or our time. One of the leading anti-smoking activists, a respected researcher and medical doctor, said on this show that calling outdoor smoking a health hazard distracts from the more provable campaigns against smoking. This was not some Big Tobacco apologist.

Others argue that even if there are not provable health risks, we can legislate life style issues. Really? Do we want government, even our own, to pass laws regulating personal behavior that poses no harm to others? You may not appreciate the smell of tobacco even when it does nothing bad to your health, but there are questions of choice and personal freedoms you must always consider.

At the very least, as we learned some 20 years ago, we should wait for the state to act, not try this experiment as a self-inflicted legislative wound.

Hopefully, a rational compromise can be achieved. If not, more later.

"It just doesn't feel like a neighborhood," North Rexford Drive resident Mitch Waldow said.

The council noted that parking is available for the restaurant workers in the parking lot at 221 North Crescent which currently closes at 11 p.m. The city suggested that with the new restrictions in place the lot should be kept open until 2 a.m. or later.

"There are certain constants in this world," Councilmember Nancy Krasne said, "death, taxes and parking problems in Beverly Hills."

According to Kunz nearly 135,000 citations are issued by the city annually and cost the recipients \$45 a piece. This generates nearly \$6,075,000 for the city each year and with the new restrictions the number is sure to increase. How did you get to Beverly Hills? I came to Beverly Hills when I was ten years old and went to Hawthorne School. Then I went to Beverly High [class of 1967] and

UCLA. I lived at home until I got a job with the BHUSD in 1973. I had always had my sights on teaching in Beverly Hills, if I decided that I going to be a teacher. I was fortunate to apply for a job when there were a lot of seasoned teachers with a lot of tenure, so when I was seeking employment, I was a bargain!

Did growing up here influence you to become a teacher?

Slightly. I believed that I had a really excellent education in Beverly Hills. But I trained as an artist and that is a difficult existence. But I became a teacher because I wanted to have an opportunity to give back to the community that gave me so much.

Who were your mentors and role models?

One mentor was [former Hawthorne social studies teacher] George Fourgis. He was my 7th or 8th grade history teacher. Dynamic, mesmerizing, he made you feel history. He brought it to life. He was theatrical, funny. All of the qualities in a teacher that keep you engrossed.

I had a 6th grade teacher named Mrs. Reed. She wore her hair in a bob she must have had her heyday in the '30's. In the 6th grade it was still one teacher for all subjects and she brought a real old fashioned experience to learning. She taught handwriting and gave out handwriting awards. I remember that she had the most beautiful penmanship. It was a tight knit class.

Another teacher was Mr. [John] McFadden, an absolutely dapper, well-groomed gentleman. He was in the Army reserves. His claim to fame was that he made us all memorize states and capitals, it would drive us crazy. He would always crack his yardstick on the desk and would chew gum, which would also drive us crazy because we weren't allowed to chew gum. It was very strange to come back and teach in the district you grew up in. Trippy.

Who did you work with at El Rodeo?

Julie Stomne Roswal, she sadly passed last year. She was so qualified and very dedicated

and so exceptional. She could have been anything in the world but she had a tenacity about her, an excellence. She was the ESL [English as a second language] teacher and special education teacher. A little bird of a woman but an absolute powerhouse and she just loved children. She had a good good soul. She was very meticulous. She had so much integrity, she was a fighter.

Rhoda Bergman was a science teacher and another powerhouse of a woman. She lived up the street from me and even after she retired she still taught. She was an artist and just vivid in my mind.

Gil Young came after me and he was a real art teacher's teacher. He was such a completely talented person and it was an honor to know him. He had to ultimately take a classroom job rather than be an art specialist. I admire him endlessly.

And the librarian at the time was Mary Blair. The library was such a spectacular reflection of her dedication and love. She made sure that every grade had their textbooks. She knew her books and was a renaissance woman, the school district was fortunate to have her in their ranks.

Ultimately I found affection for most all of my colleagues over time, as I listened to their stories and found out who they were.

I had a series of different classroom aides who were parents also. One aide, Susie Wallach, who is now the secretary at El Rodeo School, she is an amazing woman. She became very high up in her union. Brought up two children and helped to keep me organized.

Another great aide was [the late] Frankie Simantob she was capable and wonderful, well of means, a real bridge between the Persian community and the rest of us. A kind, wonderful and generous woman.

Susan Chowaiki a wonderful mother, she is still a friend of mine to this day. Dynamic and amazing. This is a woman who had three children with her middle child a high functioning autistic, she was a powerhouse. I am privileged to know her. She is multi talented multifaceted person. Beautiful, she could do a lot of things. I was privileged to meet some very special parents and children as a teacher. It made my job such a pleasure for me.

Who were some of your memorable students?

Michele Lanke was former student in the '80's. She was from my first 4th grade class and she became a rabbi. We remained friends

over all these years. I am also in touch with Susan Chowaiki's son Ezra Chowaiki. Sam Nazarian was my student, he now owns all those clubs in LA. And Eddie Wang, his parents were so kind to me when I decided to go to Taiwan during my travels. These are the kinds of connections I made. There are many other names, but these are a few. It doesn't even touch the surface.

What were some of the memorable moments of your career?

All I wanted to do was be an art teacher but once I got the opportunity to do it, I was really upset. I took a leave of absence after I did. I basically taught everything because I had my secondary and elementary credentials. My first job was teaching 7th grade, ultimately I taught 2nd, 3rd, 4th, 7th grade history and then I finally got to teach art, which was what I really wanted to do anyway, but it was awful. It turned into a crisis. The Chinese definition of crisis is a dangerous opportunity. I considered what that experience was like for me and I definitely consider it a dangerous opportunity.

I was so excited because finally a full time art position opened and it was just the worst position of all. The principal at the time gave me the responsibility of teaching art to the students who did not want to take a foreign language, [but] they were basically the problem kids, I really didn't know what to do. There were just terrible things done to me. This seventh grade class had just finished tormenting their previous teacher and they moved on to me. Can you picture my attitude with students that don't care about anything and me I was so excited to be teaching art? I received a death threat and the assistant principal said there was nothing they could do about it. They put a tack on the deaf girl's seat. I just wasn't ready for that. So I took leave, I moved to New York and loved it. I was offered an opportunity to teach 2nd grade back in Beverly Hills, so I came back. That was my niche. Kids at that age are very open and receptive to learning. I adored teaching second grade.

I adored my 3rd and 4th grade teaching experience, too. The students were wonderful. Very character building. It taught me that if you overcome your obstacles it builds character and develops you. All this time I had thought that if I had this job I would have time to do my art. But in the end I took my job more seriously than I took anything else in my life. I had these children's lives in my hands. It is magical the trust involved when you are given such a role in these little children's lives.

Why did you decide to retire?

I got married and became pregnant at 38 and I felt having a stable home with mom and dad was the most important thing. That is was why I decided to leave. When I left the district it was on a leave of absence because of my child. Then I hurt my back so I went on medical leave of absence. Later I wanted to come back part time and they said there were no positions available. So I ended up retiring.

What are you doing now?

I became an activist in the City of Santa Monica, where I live, and wanted my city to become as safe and special as it could be. At one point the LA Times had a Westside section and I ranked 43rd in its list of important people for my tenacious protection of my neighborhood. I think I really helped change some of the policies for better or worse. I used what I learned from teaching to stand up for my rights. It strengthened my beliefs. I was involved for many many years. And now, as my daughter is just finishing her freshman year of college, I am just beginning to get reinvolved in my art.

I am still in touch with the Beverly Hills community, too. My sister, Marcy Landres, is the reading specialist at Beverly Vista and my sister-in-law, Irene Sandler worked at Beverly Vista as a 6th grade English teacher. My husband, Jerry Bass, and I met in German class at Beverly High. I am on the 40th reunion committee [for the class of '67]. It will be held Sept 29 at [former mayor Max Salter's] house.

If you could do it all over again, what would you change?

I would be more respectful of the time parents need to have with their children. I would have been much more lenient with the amount of homework I gave. I would have never given homework over vacation. For the record, I apologize to all of the students who had to labor over their homework for more than 15 minutes.

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coverstory **BEVERLY HIGH TO ELIMINATE** ALL PRE ALGEBRA COURSES But some fear low performing students

could be left behind

Beverly Hills Unified has approved a reconfiguration of math courses at the middle and high school levels that will essentially eliminate any math courses below the algebra level at Beverly High.

The reconfiguration will begin during the 2007-2008 school year and is, in part, a response to the district's API scores. Current API calculations assign a minimum 200 point score to students who do not complete the state standard course at the appropriate grade level. If a student has not completed Algebra 1 by grade 9, the 200 point score is assigned, which lowers scores for the entire district.

For the 2005-2006 school year nearly 31 percent of BHUSD students at the eighth grade level will not have completed algebra. At the ninth grade level, more than 20 percent of students were enrolled in below Algebra 1 or Algebra B courses, lowering BHUSD's base API score.

Currently the high school has three classes below the algebra level: Math A, Math Workshop, and Algebra A. The BHUSD proposed program will eliminate those courses altogether.

According to California Standards Testing data, during the 2005-2006 school year nearly 52 percent of students in grade 11 were not proficient in math, 36 percent in grade ten, 31 percent in grade nine, and 22 percent in grade eight.

Out of the 564 Beverly High students in the ninth grade, 16 are enrolled in Math Workshop, 78 in Math A and 105 in Algebra A.

"As it works now, if you are tenth grader

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in Math A you'd better be successful in Algebra A and B or you won't graduate," Beverly High math teacher Len Mitchell said. "We would like to see [students] in at least a geometry level class before they graduate. With the new program kids will be taking pre algebra courses in middle school rather than high school so they will be better prepared in high school. I think it is great because we want them to be prepared and successful."

In order to cope with the higher level math courses at the high school level, the middle schools will be forced to restructure their pre algebra courses. Beginning Algebra will become Algebra A and students who pass the class will then spend their ninth grade year in Algebra B, putting them at the college preparatory level once they arrive at the high school.

Algebra A and B are basically Algebra 1 with an extended learning time of two years rather than one. Algebra B will be the lowest level math course offered at Beverly High once the program begins to take effect. Students who fail to grasp math at the algebra level will be provided with various

methods of learning support. The plan at the middle school level, according to Hawthorne Principal Alex Cherniss, is to implement intervention support, in the form of mathematic elective courses and summer school, to support the students who struggle to grasp the algebra

before heading off to the high school. "The more kids in college prep courses at the high school, the better," Cherniss said.

The plan for students struggling with the

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algebra level courses at the high school is very similar. According to Mitchell, students who are not successful in the first semester of Algebra A can repeat the first semester again during the second semester and then take the second semester of Algebra A in summer school to get caught up with the Algebra B level by their ninth grade year.

"Some problems I have found with my students in Math A are attendance and completing homework," Mitchell said. "So there is going to have to be more of an effort made. Most of my students are capable of being successful in my math class but they make poor choices."

The district anticipates that there will be two reasons for students to struggle with the increased math requirement. They will either not grasp the math conceptually or they will struggle to complete the homework requirements and lack in classroom participation. For those students, Assistant Superintendent Ilene Straus believes that different math interventions for each different type of child will solve the problem.

According to the current Beverly High requirements, in order to graduate students must meet the minimum California state requirements of two years with only Algebra proficiency. With their new proposal, BHUSD is recommending that by 2011 the requirement for Beverly High be three years of mathematics with a mastery of Algebra and Geometry and a recommendation of four years of math.

"As for students who do not master Geometry in the five years of education on the

subject, since eighth grade, we believe unless there are learning disabilities involved, which we will deal with, the students can master this with intervention and support," Straus said.

Beverly Hills is not alone with this policy change. Districts across the state such as LAUSD, San Diego, Santa Monica, and Los Virgenes have also increased the math standard.

"Most districts have aligned their math requirements to Cal State and UC requirements because we want our students to have the option to go to a 4 year university when they graduate and I believe Beverly Hills wants their students to be college ready," Straus said.

Most Beverly High students take over three years of math with only 10.9 percent failing to complete their algebra mastery requirement. 11.5 percent have geometry mastery upon graduation, 21.9 percent have taken a second year of algebra, and the majority 55.9 percent have higher than second year of algebra.

"More than half of students are doing far beyond the proposed requirement," Straus said. "89.1 percent are already meeting current requirements. The ratio is around ten percent that are only graduating with algebra mastery. They are our target."

As for those ten percent of students, Straus does not believe that the increased math requirement will reduce the graduation rate.

"We fully anticipate and believe that the graduation will not drop," Straus said. "What we do expect is a greater success rate in higher level mathematics."
