Weekly to defend itself against frivolous Courier lawsuit

Beverly Hills Weekly Publisher Josh Gross says his newspaper will vigorously defend itself against a frivolous lawsuit

Smith: wants a monopoly, Gross says

filed by rival publication, Beverly Hills Courier.

"I just received the lawsuit Wednesday afternoon, but from what I read, the Courier is alleging that we haven't properly published some legal notices in the Weekly," Gross said. "This is without merit."

In its printed edition Friday, the Courier alleged a suit would be filed that day in Superior Court.

"What's really going on here," Gross said, "is that [Courier Publisher] Clif Smith is trying to drive us out of business so that he can have a monopoly and a one-newspaper town. What he hasn't been able to accomplish in the free market, he's hoping to have the courts do."

Beverly Hills Weekly is represented by attorney Lisa Grace-Kellogg, a nationally recognized expert in newspaper adjudication law.

Smith was the target of several unflattering mailers during the 2013 Beverly Hills city council race, funded by the Beverly Hills/West Hollywood Democratic Club, which questioned a number of Smith's business practices. One such mailer even detailed Smith's attempts to strong-arm the council into giving the Courier an exclusive advertising contract with the City of Beverly Hills.

"Clif is upset because his paper is half the size that it was when he bought it from [Courier founder] March Schwartz," Gross said.

Smith, a Pasadena resident, purchased the Beverly Hills Courier in 2004. Gross, a lifelong Beverly Hills resident, founded Beverly Hills Weekly in 1999.

"Clif Smith purports to be a conservative Republican who supports tort reform," Gross said. "But he is the filing the ultimate frivolous lawsuit."

Water rates to rise by five percent

The Beverly Hills City Council voted 4-1 to accept an ad hoc committee's recommendation to raise the water rates this year by five percent, down from the earlier decision to raise them by seven percent, at the formal meeting on Thursday night.

Mayor John Mirisch dissented.

"The [Metropolitan Water District] rates are less than 40 percent of our overall costs, so if we were just passing along the five percent MWD rate increase to the residents, it should be no more than a two percent increase and that's what I would have supported for this year," said Mirisch.

Mirisch said the rate was still being increased, but by a reduced amount.

According to City Manager Jeff Kolin, in the last six years, the city has had an eight percent increase followed by an eight, 15, 15, seven, and seven percent rate increase for a total of 60.

MWD has raised its rates by 15, 21, six, 6.7, 6.7, and a five percent increase in the same period for a total of 58.5 percent.

All councilmembers supported placing the \$2.5 million previously set aside from last year's \$10.2 million surplus to be placed in the stormwater fund.

"These rate increases are not just the cost of water we get from MWD, but also the fact that we have our own system here that we need to run, maintain and manage, our own water lines, our wells, our water treatment plant, the bonded indebtedness of the water treatment plant as well as our reservoir system and these are all things we've decided we want in the city to protect the city in the long-term and as a result there's a real cost to that," said Councilmember Willie Brien.

Water usage, cost of water, infrastructure maintenance and cost of operations all contribute to the cost of the water rates, according to the staff report.

The more successful the City is in promoting water conservation the more each unit of water costs the customers.

Gold said the combination of fixed costs in the form of infrastructure maintenance and the variable costs, such as the price of water had led the council to approve the seven percent rate increase initially.

However, in the last year, the City had not conserved as much water and as a result, the amount of revenue was \$2.9 million, which can be used to offset to reduce the rate increase to five percent.

When the budget documents return, the council will vote on a resolution approving the rates.

City council may decide to launch an independent study on AT&T installation

The City Council heard a staff presentation on Thursday night regarding an agreement approved by the council on April 11 with AT&T that would install up to 76 nodes in the City, increasing cell coverage for first responders.

"A couple of weeks ago, I watched you stand by a decision that had been made

Board of Education tables bond acceleration; to return June 25

The Board of Education tabled a resolution on Tuesday night that would have accelerated the Measure E bond schedule, increasing the property tax rate for residents and breaking the promise made to voters in 2008.

Board of Education President Jake Manaster said the Board was tabling the item to hold town meetings in order to involve the community.

"I'm coming tonight to implore you not to raise the community's taxes by accelerating Measure E," said former Board member Myra Lurie, who was one of the lead organizers of the Measure E campaign. "To do so is to violate an expressed and explicit promise. It would seriously harm the community's trust in you and it will seriously damage any chance of your getting a parcel tax passed."

Several members of the community addressed the board during the public comment portion of the meeting to voice concerns about accelerating the bond and to thank the Board for allowing the town hall meetings. Board of Education member Lisa Korbatov arrived late.

Lurie said she had heard the Board criticize the MTA for "bait-and-switch" tactics.

"I believe that bait and switch is exactly what this board would do if it did accelerate the bond," said Lurie. "The very cornerstone of our campaign was an explicit promise that the bond would not raise the tax rate."

Former Mayor Robert K. Tanenbaum said he had been a supporter of Measure E when the measure was put before the voters in 2008.

"Our credibility is critical, so the notion that we honor the promises that we made are part of that equation for credibility," said Tanenbaum, who also thanked the board for the proposed meetings.

Tanenbaum said the people needed to be a part of the process as they were when the measure was approved.

Hawthorne parent Isabel Hacker thanked the Board for considering the concerns of

by the Planning Commission because it had gone through the proper process. We had found that important, so shouldn't the same thing apply to the council?" said Pam Meadow, who called revisiting the issue a delay.

On May 11, Municipal League Chairman Thomas White, Southwest Homeowner's Association President Ken Goldman, Marilyn Gallup, former Mayor Chuck Aronberg and realtor Michael Libow approached the council with concerns about safety and concerns that an independent analysis by the City had not been done.

White called the presentation from Thursday night a "regurgitation from staff."

"We asked that the council take an independent unbiased look at this with a completely disinterested party, an expert in communications and the environment

the community and presenting the idea of town hall meetings.

"I believe that communication involves developing a clear message and sending the message, interpreting the message and most importantly receiving feedback," said Hacker. "There has been an absence of this process and I believe that going forward with these town hall meetings now and taking feedback from the community as it relates to accelerating the bond will hopefully make your case for your wish to accelerate."

Hacker is rumored to be considering a run for the Board of Education in November.

Under the current issuance plan which allows for the voter-approved tax rate of \$49.71 per \$100,000 in assessed value, the full \$334-million approved by Measure E, would not be released until 2037 and the rest of the bond would be issued entirely as capital appreciation bonds (CABS), which allow school districts to defer interest until their maturity at a higher rate.

Legislation imposing restrictions on capital appreciation bonds are currently being discussed in the state legislature, which would limit the maximum maturity of a bond from 40 years to 25 years and reduce the maximum interest rate on a bond from 12 percent to eight percent. CAB usage would require public analysis and would require a maximum debt repayment ratio of four to one.

The State Assembly passed the bill unan-

imously in April. The bill will go to the State Senate and if passed and signed by the governor, changes will be implemented on Jan. 1, 2014.

Current interest bonds pay interest semi-annually and at a lower rate.

If the bond is accelerated and the legislation is passed, the bonds would be issued as approximately 50 percent current interest bonds and 50 percent capital appreciation bonds.

Under the maximum tax rate legally allowed under proposition 39, property owners would initially pay \$111 per \$100,000 eventually decreasing slowly in increments until about 2031 when the rate would level off at \$60 per \$100,000 until it is paid off, according to an attachment to the agenda.

Whether the district accelerates the Measure E bond or not, the district may still issue \$25 million in bond sales in 2013.

Every school district that expects to issue bonds during the fiscal year of 2013 to 2014 and require estimated debt service payments between July 1, 2013, and December 31, 2014, is required to provide the County of Los Angeles a notice of intent to issue such bonds by June 30, 2013.

According to Superintendent Gary Woods, the district plans on organizing three town hall meetings at the various school sites prior to June 20. The item will return for discussion on June 25.

and we're back here already," said White. "We have no such expert that's been engaged and instead of getting answers on that level of expertise, which I think the community is entitled, we have a regurgitation by staff of the same information purporting to answer the questions which were posed," said White.

Twelve speakers addressed the council with eight speaking in favor of the agreement and four speaking against.

The agreement has already been executed. Some speakers felt there had been a lack of process by revisiting the issue.

"We should have finality in our concept. What does the finality mean when our city council votes five to nothing, unanimously? That should be the end to it," said Eli Blumenfeld. "We have a system to protect. That is the finality and respect for the process."

Vice Mayor Lili Bosse said she was

offended by anyone who suggested it was an "us and them" in the room. Bosse said she felt everyone cared about public safety of residents and schools.

"When any resident comes before us and feels that we haven't done our due diligence and there's still questions that need to be answered, I feel it is my responsibility as a councilmember to provide those answers," said Bosse. "I will guarantee you that when I walk down this street in this city on any issue, you will know that I've done my homework and can back it up with information."

All councilmembers agreed with continuing the contract. Councilmember Nancy Krasne said she would like the architectural commission to look at the landscaping around the cabinets, which will house the nodes.

Councilmember Julian Gold said his

opinion on the project had not changed since the council voted on the agreement in April. Councilmember Willie Brien said he would continue to support the recommendations of the fire and police chiefs.

Mayor John Mirisch said the council had not done its homework in getting enough information and it would be worth exploring how to lessen the impacts. Bosse supported the independent study and said the money spent was worth it to have the information.

A subcommittee will be formed to discuss what guidelines would need to be included in an independent study. The council will decide whether or not to pay for an independent study after the subcommittee outlines what would go into the study. According to the staff report, staff estimated an independent study could cost approximately \$18,000.

The program is expected to improve first responder wireless communication and provide safer 9-1-1 coverage. The equipment will be housed in a cabinet on the ground and the antennas will be distributed on Beverly Hills street light poles or free-standing poles.

Those who use AT&T in the City would have better cell phone coverage within the City of Beverly Hills.

The project comes at no extra cost to the City and AT&T will pay an annual licensing fee of \$184,850 to the City's general fund, under the terms of the agreement.

Council discusses ESL program structure

After voting unanimously on May 7 to approve an English as a second language program for adults, the city council discussed the structure of the program, expected to include six courses.

"When this first came forward they were going to lose ESL entirely, so from my perspective, we're doing a good job that we're able to save the ESL program, but it's not going to be what it was at the high school," said Vice Mayor Lili Bosse. "In many ways we're actually going to be adding more in terms of availability and citizenship, etc."

Due to budget reductions, the BHUSD can no longer support providing English as a second language course for adults.

Assistant Director of Community Services Nancy Hunt-Coffey presented staff's recommendation for a model of the program.

Staff recommended that the City offer six contractual classes, which would be comprised of introductory, intermediate and advanced ESL, two English conversation courses and one citizen preparation course.

The recommendation included the hiring of multiple contract instructors to

Roxbury Park Community Center Groundbreaking Ceremony set for June 4

BENDHEIM MEANS BUSINESS

The Weekly's exclusive interview with incoming Chamber of Commerce President John Bendheim

So, how did you become involved with the Chamber of Commerce's board of directors?

[I got involved because] Nellie Sedigh of Tiffany's had asked me about 10 years ago to come on the board and I had always respected Tiffany's and certainly, her.

Tell us about your priorities for the coming year as president of the chamber.

What I want to do is reinforce, innovate and reinvigorate the chamber. I was involved in helping them relocate to the new building that they're in right now, and it's just one of the state of the art buildings here in Beverly Hills. We're very excited about that and my quote is, "Success never stands still" or "There's no love affair with the status quo." I think [that] thanks to [Executive Director] Alex Stettinski and [current President] Steve Ghysels and Bruce Schulman, we've really changed the culture and tried to create innovation and focus on the future of Beverly Hills.

We've made some really good strides as to what's going on in that chamber, and so I'm very excited about some of the new things that we're going to be doing.

Last year, when we interviewed outgoing President Steve Ghysels, he said, "Chambers in general are all across the country reinventing themselves right now. We need to demonstrate our relevancy to our members." What are some of the ways the chamber has done that?

The chamber membership has increased about 14 percent from 595 members to 680 members. We've really diversified our board of directors with auto dealers, banks, retailers, entertainment, restaurants, and real estate. We're bringing on new board members such as Tishman Speyer, George Comfort, and the superintendent of the Beverly Hills Unified School District. This has been a very good and welcomed change.

Every board member is now required to serve on a committee to help our new

programs and bring them to the next level. Our city relations with [City Manager] Jeff Kolin, the mayor and members of the city council have really improved dramatically. I think that's really an amazing fact and feat. Our government affairs committee is becoming more political. I think this year the committee will make bolder recommendations on the issues that affect our business community. Our economic development committee has brought in some really great speakers like the state controller, John Chiang, State Senator Ted Lieu and the Dodgers president.

The things that we also want to move forward with is we want to attract, retain and engage businesses in Beverly Hills. [At our New York Sales Mission] in October, we talk to many businesses that could come in to our community. The chamber's created a shop local program [to reach] out to the residents and the people who work in Beverly Hills. I think we've done a great job with our e-newsletter and we have about 2,052 subscribers now. The traffic on the website has really increased. I think promoting and advertising local offers for residents and employees of Beverly Hills will go over very, very well.

We created the first ever flash mob. I think we want to continue that and see [Vice Mayor] Lili Bosse dance her heart out. That was pretty cool. We're going to engage the UCLA Anderson School of Management research unit to help consult with us and talk about some business opportunities. There's a broker roundtable -- you know, I've been in real estate for

many years now -- we invite them to discuss space opportunities and the business leads in the city and it's a way to spearhead business growth in Beverly Hills.

Something that we're talking about in my [term] with Alex Stettinski, who's done an amazing job, [is a BID on South Beverly Drive]. This would be between Wilshire and Olympic Boulevard. I think there's a strong interest in creating a BID down there.

Can you explain what that means?

A business district. [Stettinski] has created one in downtown L.A., but it will bring the small businesses together if they need valet parking or whatever their issues are to make business more sustainable.

What are some of the benefits that come with creating a business district?

The businesses can put together the program that they want. The number one issue there is parking. How do they make parking reasonable and good for the shoppers there? Is it a valet service? Can they work with the city to build a parking lot of some kind? Those are all interesting ideas of how to promote business there.

We're [also] going to create a Beverly Hills map with the [Conference and Visitor's Bureau]. Apparently, there is no map where all the properties are listed. I think the map will ensure that the locals and the visitors alike will have accurate information on where to shop, eat and play. That will be important. I think we're looking at develop-

ing a business development center to offer business counseling and education seminars in our chamber building. The classes, such as accounting, law and marketing, will be taught by professionals coming from local colleges.

Is this just in the beginning stages at this point?

All of this is on the docket and we want to do more for the Centennial celebration as you can imagine: 100 years. We have things that

are going to be fun, and we're going to try and do some innovative things this year.

What is your strategy for both attracting new businesses to Beverly Hills and retaining existing businesses?

We have to focus on the membership benefits where we can add value to our members. That's the key. We always have to meet the needs of the business community and provide value to our members, so what we've done in the chamber is brought in some new people. [Director of Economic Development and Government Affairs] Andy Sywak, [Marketing & Graphic Design Associate] Jonathan Siegel and [Membership & Executive Coordinator]

Mary Altamirano are new. Charisse Older has come in to spur the marketing campaign. She has a lot of expertise. She has a lot of experience in marketing and sponsorship. We want to focus on customer service. We want to be honest, ethical and have high integrity. We want to build on these advocacy programs where we would like to take deeper political stands on some of these issues coming forward. I think the online presence has become bigger and bigger for our members and programs. The government affairs program has been a very active partner with the city and we look forward to our continued partnership.

What advice has current President Steve Ghysels given you?

I think Steve has really been the one that's promoting that focus on the membership benefits. I think what he's taught me is we have to work with our constituency and the businesses to attract, retain and engage these businesses. If you look at the city, I think it has weathered the recession really, really well. I think 90 percent of the retail space in the business triangle has been leased and about 80 percent of the office space is leased. I think this culture is changing and the city is getting hot again. I'm on the board of the Wallis Annenberg Center for Performing Arts and that's going to open in October. I think that's a game changer for the City of Beverly Hills. We'll have an exciting nightlife with cultural, educational programs for the adults and the children.

You are the president of Bendheim Enterprises. Tell us about that.

It's basically investing in real estate here in the city. I have some holdings in Las Vegas, Nevada and other areas back east. It's a diversified portfolio of retail and residential and commercial.

What are some projects you've been involved in?

In Beverly Hills, I have the building where [retailer] James Perse is in. We brought in James Perse and there's a little beach in there. You go in there and you can buy casual t-shirts and pretend you're at the beach. It's very, very well done.

You mentioned you were involved the chamber's relocation to its current building. How were you involved in that?

I was on the executive committee there with [Athens Group's] Jay Newman and [Mercedes-Benz's] Bruce Schulman. We were basically the chamber liaisons with the city when we negotiated the second floor of that building. We were previously on South Beverly Drive and now we've moved into this great building, so it's just a win-win for our employees because when you have great office space, you wake up every day and say, "I want to come to work" in that kind of place and environment.

How will your background in real estate investment help you as president of the chamber?

I do a lot of businesses besides real estate.

I've run businesses and I invest in businesses and I have different technologies that I invest in. I have a very diverse background. I've been an entrepreneur for all my life. I'm very qualified to look at what we can do and what we should do here in the city to attract, retain, and engage local businesses and help the residents to participate in the shop local program.

Your philanthropic efforts include contributions to the Heart Stem Cell Center at Cedars-Sinai.

Yes, I'm on the board of trustees [at Cedars-Sinai] and I'm on several other boards. I'm on the board of directors of California Republic Bank, which is located on Crescent and Wilshire. I've been on the Los Angeles Sports and Entertainment Commission. I was chairman for four years. I'm on the USC Board of Leaders for the Marshall School [of Business] and several other different committees at Cedars-Sinai, which I love and a couple of other boards I'm involved in that are both public and private.

What attracted you to the Heart Stem Cell Center?

The most amazing part of the center is that Cedars-Sinai brought in a doctor named Eduardo Marbán. He came from Johns Hopkins. We brought him and his wife over to start the Heart Stem Cell Institute where basically he'll take your stem cells, put them in his lab and put them back into your heart and regenerate your heart. Hopefully, one day he can win the Nobel Prize. If his research is proven successful, this will be a major game changer in the healthcare arena. Heart disease is the number one cause of death for men and women and the Cedars-Sinai Heart Stem Cell Institute will save millions and millions of lives. I'm not a doctor but anybody would be so excited to see that and we have many friends that have blockage -- 20, 30, 50 percent blockage -- of their heart and some of this can really help them.

You've established the John Bendheim Executive in Residence Program at the

USC Marshall School of Business. Tell us about that.

I wanted to give the students at USC a different perspective of business and some of the great speakers and business people in Los Angeles. One of the big ones we did was with Rob Lowe and Tom Barrack -- they bought Miramax -- and we had them come speak. We've had several other speakers: Chris DeWolfe of Myspace and Lynda Resnick. These people all have great perspective on entertainment and business. The one that we did with [Lowe and Barrack] -- I think there were 1,500 people in the Bovard Auditorium. A lot of people can really listen and learn from the ventures these people have gone through or the adventures, I should say.

So it's a lecture series?

It is a lecture series and we do it about four times a year. We had Bob Iger from Disney come in and speakers of that caliber. What they'll do is they'll come and teach a class before the lecture series and then go into some more detail with the

lecture series.

Tell us about your family.

I have my wife, Cathi, and my daughter Alexandra who will be a junior at University of Pennsylvania. She just declared her major in urban studies and she has a great internship with Rick Caruso of Caruso Affiliated, so we're very proud of her.

In what area, does the chamber need the most improvement?

I think in attracting membership to the organization. Why do people want to join the chamber now? I think in the past the reason to join has not been as compelling as it will be in the future. I believe now we have an innovative and exciting opportunity to participate in an organization that can deliver world class events as well as advocate for the business community within the city. That's going to be the key -- that we have to make this chamber desirable for people inside and outside the city to join.

teach the course with each working no more than 12 hours in a given week.

Hunt-Coffey said she had been contacted by the current ESL teacher at the district and that she had said the 12 hour cap was unrealistic.

A majority of council members supported the recommendation and directed staff to explore increasing the hours to 18 per week.

Councilmember Nancy Krasne wanted one full time position.

"If no one is really in charge of the program of ESL, then we have a problem because it will fall apart and it won't be any good," said Krasne. "Somebody has to be held accountable at all times to monitor [and] evaluate."

Two to three courses are proposed to be offered in the summer with the rest initiating in the fall or winter. The starting fee is proposed for \$85 with a 70/30 percent split between the instructor and the city, 70 percent going to the instructor.

City Attorney Larry Wiener said he would sit with Hunt-Coffey and explore what the risk to the city might be if the hours were expanded to 18 per instructor.

Mayor John Mirisch said he hoped they would be able to expand to other languages if the program is successful.

Board approves bidding process for replacement projects at various campuses

The Board of Education unanimously approved the bidding process for equipment and infrastructure replacement at three of the school sites on Tuesday night.

"These are all items that we've talked about before but they're only needing to be done because the buildings have not had really any maintenance done on them," said Board President Jake Manaster.

The repairs include replacement for electrical distribution at Hawthorne with a

project budget of \$405,000, and sewer system at Hawthorne for \$33,700.

At El Rodeo, the board approved the bidding process for replacement of a chiller and cooling tower, replacement of sewer pipes, and a replacement of selective electrical and lighting system, with a projected budget of \$595,000, \$145,800, and \$207,968, respectively.

The repairs also include chilled water pumps at Beverly Vista for a budget of \$202,500.

"I just want to say that as time goes on -- this is going to be our future: spending a lot of money on band aids and I think we should all be thinking about that," said Board member Lisa Korbatov.

In March, the board approved agreements with Henrikson Owen Group and BP & Associates to prepare engineering design for the projects.

Staff will also submit design for electrical and lighting system replacement at El Rodeo to the Division of State Architect approval.

City Council provides cost of living adjustment for City attorney services

The Beverly Hills City Council voted 4-1 to provide a cost of living adjustment with Richards Watson and Gershon for City attorney services.

Councilmember Nancy Krasne dissented.

The resolution agreed upon by the council sets a cost of living adjustment of one percent effective on July 1, 2013, plus a one-time payment of \$10,000. The one percent constitutes an additional annual expense of \$11,300.

The City's current agreement with the firm states that the city will provide a cost of living adjustment of no less than one percent and no more than three percent.

A resolution to provide a one-year compensation to the City manager was removed from the agenda.

Fine art commission discusses fine art ordinance, proposal for artwork relocation at Two Rodeo

The Fine Art Commission met on May 22 to discuss the fine art ordinance and a proposal for a relocation of artwork from Two Rodeo.

The commission has been working to revise the existing Fine Art Ordinance to make it clearer to developers and to clarify what constitutes fine art and how to remove a piece of art if something is no longer an appropriate piece for the City.

"We were very, very happy to have a meeting with our liaisons, which is Dr. Julian Gold and Mrs. Lili Bosse," said Fine Art Commission Chair Fiona Chalom. "At this juncture, my understanding is that it will be going to the city attorney's office for their review, so that it could be further refined and hopefully then brought back to city council."

The commission was also offered a donation to the City by an anonymous donor of a sculpture by the artist, America Martin, to be placed on Burton Way.

"The Fine Art Commission at this time felt that we would rather decline that very generous donation given the limited spaces along the street," said Chalom.

The commission had been notified of a missing art piece at Two Rodeo Drive in October, which has since been identified as two sculptural columns. The columns originally fulfilled the fine art obligation for the property.

The commission had a representative from Two Rodeo speak to the commission informing them that he had been misinformed regarding the ability to remove the piece, which they did. The missing art piece is now in storage.

"Right now, we're in the process of trying to decide what would be best. Should they bring it back or would it be better for them to pay out the portion of what would have been owed?" said Chalom. "We're

going to have more conversation with regards to what's the best option for all concerned."

The commission will soon have a priority exercise where the commissioners will review and discuss possible suggestions for artists that the commission is interested in considering over the next few years. The city's newest piece was the Jaume Plensa's Endless V, which was installed in January.

Krasne, Bosse block proposed Crescent Street closure

The Beverly Hills City Council heard a presentation for a proposed Gran Fondo Giro d'Italia Beverly Hills Bike Ride Event to be held November 2 to 3. Liaisons Councilmember Nancy Krasne and Vice Mayor Lili Bosse said the recommendation in the report had not been consistent with what the liaison had discussed in their meeting.

"It sounds like what the liaison recommended and was discussing is not what is reflected here," said Mayor John Mirisch. "We'll ask to go back and get it right next time and maybe have another meeting, so that the staff report accurately reflects what the liaisons discussed."

The event is part of a worldwide series of biking events. A "gran fondo" is a recreational bike event that starts with a festive launch and concludes with a festival. Bosse and Krasne said they were both under the impression that Crescent Drive would not be closed during this event.

"I was trying to keep the flow of traffic available and open to the public," said Krasne. "I hate closing the street and inconveniencing everybody when we have the entire Beverly Gardens Park."

As proposed in the staff report, a bike expo would be held in the Beverly Canon Gardens on Saturday, November 2 and on Sunday, November 3, the bikes would kick off from the 300 and 400 blocks of North

Rodeo Drive and the finish line and bike expo would be located on the 400 block North Crescent Drive.

"I think part of the issue is when you came before us, Crescent Drive was requested to be closed Saturday and Sunday and we had discussed that we weren't going to do that," said Bosse, who they decided against it because the street would not have been in use during the entire time of closure.

Bosse said the event was a bike ride and not a race and did not require the entire street to be closed.

Bosse also said the liaison had not had a discussion about making the city a sponsor of the event.

The route for the event has not been finalized but would include three options for participants: a short route of 20 to 30 miles, a medium route of 50 to 60 miles and a long route of 90 to 100 miles.

The street closures outlined in the staff report had included the 300 and 400 blocks of North Rodeo Drive to close on Sunday, November 3 from 5 a.m. to 9 a.m. and the 400 block of North Crescent Drive from 6 a.m. to 6 p.m.

BHHS Runner Wins at Masters Meet
