"Council Hears Draft Rent Stabilization Report" [Issue 984]

The City Council met last week to discuss the Rent Stabilization Ordinance ("RSO"). Last night was the first of three meetings to discuss various aspects of the RSO.

We wrote a letter to Mayor Gold and Councilmember Wunderlich as well as to all other Councilmembers.. We had been informed that the RSO was enacted because of ineffective regulations, rapid rent rises, and tenant displacement. None of these reasons was true. We obtained and analyzed four years of data (2013-2017) from Beverly Hills Code Enforcement ("CE"). The two attachments are the universe of real data (as opposed to anecdotal "evidence" presented to the Human Resources Commission). Here are the summaries of the data we found:

Summary re: allegedly rapid rent rises: There were a total of seven "rental" raise complaints registered with CE for the four-year period through March 30, 2017. Of these, CE found no violation in two cases. In four cases, where there was a potential violation, and CE investigation led to reversal of rent raises. In one case, it is not clear whether a rent raise wa reversed. In other words, one rent rise case per year over four years.

Summary re: evictions: Over the same four-year period, there were eighteen allegedly "eviction related" complaints. Most of these eviction-related complaints really dealt with other issues such as whether the new tenant was paying the same rent as the evicted tenant; whether there was an on-site manager; whether the RSO applied to a condo (it didn't); whether a new owner was responsible for paying an administrative penalty of \$500 for the prior rental property owner's failing to provide Special Notice to tenants (re: tenant rights etc.). It appears from the data that of the eighteen eviction-related complaints, just three resulted in rescission of eviction notices.

If there actually is other data that shows evictions/rent rises for the four-year period prior to and including the enactment of the RSO (2013- 2017), we haven't ever seen it.

Marvin Winans Jr. Files for Board of Education

As of August 9, Marvin Winans Jr. will be battling it out with Rachelle Marcus and Tristen Walker for a seat on the Beverly Hills Board of Education in the Nov. 6 general election.

Winans was born in Detroit and is the son of Marvin L. Winans Sr., leader of the gospel cross over group "The Winans," and gospel songstress Vickie Winans. At the age of 16, Winans formed the singing group "One Way" with his cousin Michael Winans Jr. and friends, Karl Jackson and Lance Bennett. He and Michael later joined their cousins Carvin Jr. and Juan to form "Winans Phase 2."

"Winans Phase 2" debuted at #1 on the Gospel Billboard charts, sold over 250,000 records, and performed shows in the United States, Germany, Holland, London, and Amsterdam. They also performed on The Oprah Winfrey Show, Donnie & Marie, and the Queen Latifah show. In 2002, the group toured the U.S. as part of the Winans Family Tour.

Winans attended college at Michigan State for a short time before signing a record deal with Epic Records. He later released a solo album, Image of a Man, in 2008.

"I attended Michigan State for a while and then my career came calling," he said. "I did stick with some online schooling for a bit, but didn't stay all the way through. I did finish learning outside of that. My life took me to a lot of different places and I have seen a lot of things. I'm always reading and learning."

He moved to California in February 2013 and moved to Beverly Hills last August, just in time for his son Marvin Winans Jr. III to begin first grade at Bev-

erly Vista. His younger daughters Miranda (4) and Marissa (2) will also attend BHU-SD schools in the future. Winans' wife, Monique, joined Rodeo Realty in April 2018.

Since moving to Beverly Hills, Winans has served on the Future Focused Schools team and is currently the Executive Vice President of the PTA at Bever-

"I just want to make people aware of what's happening, how they can be engaged and excited about the opportunities that exist," Winans told the Weekly in April after first being named to the PTA board.

Traffic & Parking Commission Supports New Parking Permit Zone on 500 Block of North Crescent Drive

At its meeting on August 9, the Traffic & Parking Commission voted unanimously in support of establishing a preferential parking permit zone on the 500 Block of North Crescent Drive.

A petition signed by 17 of the 23 house-

BYRON POPE, MMC City Clerk holds on the block was submitted to the commission in April 2018 requesting a permit parking regulation to address commuter parking impacts and trash generated by Business Triangle employees and visitors.

"Our street is packed every night with cars that block our driveways so that we can't find our houses," Rosalyn Rothman, who lives at 516 North Crescent Drive, said in a letter submitted with the petition. "There is trash on the street from empty food containers, and we can't tell if parked cars with drivers sitting for a while are watching our houses. If we have evening guests, there is no room for them to park... It would enhance our day to day lives if you would vote for no parking any time after 8 p.m. every day."

The preferential parking permit zone supported by the commission does just that.

If approved by the City Council at its September 17

meeting, the current non-permit regulation of '2-Hour Parking, 8 a.m. to 6 p.m., Except Sunday' on the block would be changed to the following: '2-Hour Parking, 8 a.m. to 8 p.m., Monday through Saturday, and No Parking 8 p.m. to 2:30 a.m., Daily, Permit 'BT' Exempt.'

North Rodeo Drive.

The new Cartier building is set to replace the existing two-story building at 370 North Rodeo Drive and include an outdoor terrace on a portion of the third floor, two valet spaces, a loading space, a subterranean transformer, and a partial basement. The project also requests 44 parking spaces, which will be used by both employees and shoppers, be provided through the city's In Lieu Parking Program.

Before the commission granted conditional approval for the request, the applicant's traffic engineer, Crain & Associates, conducted a parking study assessing the availability of parking spaces within four of the city's nearby parking structures. The study found that the total number of spaces in each of the lots totals 1,290 spaces. On Saturdays, the available parking supply in the lots fluctuated between 291 spaces and 824 spaces; on Tuesday, the total supply fluctuated between 180 parking spaces and 9339 parking spaces during the hours of 10:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m. It also measured the occupancy rates and total number of available spaces during peak parking periods in each structure and found that the city's existing parking supply can adequately provide the requested parking spaces.

Commissioner Lori Greene Gordon stated at the meeting that though she could make the findings to grant approval, she would prefer for Cartier to provide employee parking that did utilize the city's

public parking garages.

"I would like to suggest something to take care of employee parking separate from the in lieu parking. From a financial perspective, employee spots would be included in the in lieu parking spaces, I get that, but I want to make sure that employees have a space to park that isn't in the public lot," Gordon said. "I would hate to know we were using lots that get taken up so quickly for something like this. It would be nice if there were private lots that you could purchase employee parking from."

Three tenants currently working out of the two-story building located on the construction site will move to other locations once construction begins. Cartier will be the single tenant in the new building.

The net floor area of the three-story building will be 15,250 square feet, when taking into account all applicable floor area exemptions like those made for stairwells, elevator shafts, and mechanical rooms.

Board Demands Equality in State Funding for Public Schools

On Tuesday, the Beverly Hills Board of Education became one of more than 500 California school boards to call on the state to provide funding for public schools at the national average or higher by the year 2020.

At its meeting on August 14, the Board adopted a resolution asking the state of California to provide a more equitable level of per-pupil funding for its students. The resolution has received statewide support not only from other school boards, but also from the California School Boards Association (CSBA) and Association of California School Administrators (ACSA).

California currently ranks 45th nationally in percentage of taxable income spent on education, 41st in per-pupil funding, 45th in pupil-teacher ratios, 48th in pupil-staff ratios, and K-12 funding in the state has not substantially increased, on an inflation-adjusted basis, for more than a decade, according to the resolution.

The resolution also states that California public schools are funded at roughly \$1,961 per student less than the national average, which translates to approximately \$3,462 per student when adjusted for California being a high-cost state, and trails the average of the top 10 states by almost \$7,000 in per-pupil funding.

"In order to prepare our students for participation in a democratic society and an increasingly competitive, technology-driven global economy, California must fund schools at a level sufficient to support student success," the Board wrote in the resolution.

"Despite it's vast wealth, California

has consistently underfunded public education while widening its scope, adding new requirements and raising standards without providing appropriate resources to prepare all students for college, career and civic life," they continued.

In addition to calling for public school funding at the national average or higher by 2020, the resolution also calls on the state to provide funding at a level that is equal to or above the average of the top 10 states nationally by 2025.



On August 9, the Beverly Hills Traffic and Parking Commission voted unanimously to support the consolidation of the Preferential Parking Permit zones on the 100 blocks south of Wilshire Boulevard between Spalding and South Camden Drives.

The modified zone, which would carry an "AD" designation, would have a regulation of "No Parking, 8 a.m. to 2:30 a.m. Daily," if approved by the City Council. The "AD"

zone would also include the 100 block of McCarty Drive with the same parking regulations.

"We want to make these parking zones and regulations as unified as possible because right now each street has a different permit area. That makes it very difficult to enforce," Commission Chair Nooshin Meshkaty said. "Once they're

After heated debate, the Beverly Hills Planning Commission voted 3-2 in favor of preparing a resolution to approve three Hillside R-1 Permit requests related to the remodel of a residence at 1115 Calle Vista Drive at its meeting on August 9.

Chair Andy Licht, Vice Chair Alan Block, and Commissioner Farshid Joe Shooshani were supportive of moving the project forward, while Commissioners Lori Greene Gordon and Peter Ostroff opposed the construction.

The project involves the remodel of an existing two-story single-family resi-

dence on the property and the addition of a partially subterranean basement underneath the existing residence, a portion of which is proposed to "daylight" toward the southern side property line. It also includes the construction of an accessory swimming pool, site grading to create useable lawn areas, sitewide landscaping, development of an additional driveway to provide access to a subterranean garage.

A total of three Hillside R-1 Permits are requested for the project. The first would allow more than 1,500 cubic yards of earth material to be imported or exported from a site in the Hillside Area

on the site, to exceed 15,000 square feet. The final requested permit would allow an accessory structure (swimming pool) to be located on any part of the site within 100' of the property line.

Commissioners Gordon and Ostroff questioned how the April 2018 'Basement Ordinance' would apply to the project as it includes a "daylighting," or exposed, basement, which the 2018 ordinance banned.

"This project is subject to the 2016 ordinance," City Planner Ryan Golich said. "The ordinance that just became effective in 2018 -- that's the one that

has been referred to as the 'Basement Ordinance' -- exempted certain projects that were in the pipeline from having to comply with it. This project was exempted because the applicant applied for the R-1 permits before that ordinance went through."

Comedian and Entertainment Studios Founder/CEO Byron Allen, who owns the residence, said that he felt the process for getting the project approved was too burdensome.

"The fact that you're asking that question shows me that you don't have an open mind," Allen told Commissioner Ostroff when Ostroff asked if he would like

an opportunity to address the concerns of community members who signed a petition opposing the project.

"You sent out a notice to everybody in the city to come and talk about this

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Allen also mentioned that he had already reached out to many of the people opposing the project, including Lago Vista resident and attorney Ronald Richards, who serves as the President of the Beverly Hills Hillside Protection Association, but said he was met with racism.

"I stopped communicating with Ron Richards," he said. "Richards sent me an email where he said, 'You should take these three people off your list.' One of them is Mohamed Hadid, a real estate developer. This guy put in writing to me: 'Getting his signature is like getting an endorsement from Osama Bin Laden.' Now, as a man of color, an African American, I find that racist -- to compare someone to Osama Bin Laden because they both have Muslim names. So, you knock door to door and start seeing what you find. You keep moving the cheese. I don't think you have an open mind."

Richards denied Allen's accusation of racism.

"I sent him an email telling him to take Mohamed Hadid's name off the list and I sent him a link with a lot of exhibits and articles. Maybe he didn't read it or maybe his assistant didn't print it out for him, but he's totally confused," Richards said. "Mohamed Hadid is a convicted criminal that is the most notorious developer in Los Angeles and is probably the most hated developer in LA history. So, I asked why they would want him to support them because it's not helpful. I'm shocked that he would think the man's

disagreed.

"I agree that the basement is very large but it's not up to me to tell someone that they can't build a large house, particularly if there's no substantial adverse impact," Block said. "I don't think it will have a substantial adverse impact on the scale of the area because there's only 13,000 square feet above ground. I also don't think it has a substantial adverse impact on the integrity of the area or the character, and we know it's not going to adversely impact the privacy of any adjoining neighbor."

Following the decision, Richards said he thought the project still needed to be reviewed further by the City Council before getting final approval.

"The project is drawing a lot of concern from our organization because over 100 residents signed a petition opposing it and because it's basically trying to capitalize on the fact that a law was passed that would outlaw the very basement that they want to build," Richards said. "Any time you have a scale and mass that is double the maximum limit and you have 6,000 cubic yards of dirt that you want to export that creates a substantial impact on the community."

"I believe that this house raises serious concerns as to whether it violates that plan," Richards continued. "I think it may need to be reviewed further by the City Council because one violation leads to multiple violations, and then we don't have a General Plan anymore."

Timothy Ellis, a former math teacher and Laguna Hills athletic director, has been named the District Director of Athletics/JPA for BHUSD. Last week, The Weekly interviewed him about his top priorities and plans for the upcoming school

year Tell us about your role within the district.

District Director of Athletics/JPA is my official title. This position is a new one that was established this year. I actually just had my first day on August 1, so I'm very new here still. My job will be to oversee athletics across the entirety of the district and coordinate fields and facilities between the school and the school district through the Joint Powers Agreement (JPA).

Right now, I'm focused on getting fall sports up off the ground and running. I will have two Athletic Directors working underneath me, Vonzie Paysinger and John Braddell, and they'll help with a lot of the day-to-day work that needs to be done.

Tell us about your teaching background. For the past five years, I was a math teacher and athletic director at Laguna Hills High School. I've also been a head baseball coach at three different schools for a total of 25 years and I worked as an assistant football coach during that time as well.

What made you decide to get involved with education and athletics?

I was finished playing football and baseball in college and realized that I had to do something with my life. My high school football coach approached me about coming back and coaching for him. I did, and fell in love with coaching. I was then presented an opportunity to teach a couple of math classes as well as coach. I fell in love with the teaching side of things as well. I finished my degree in Math and became a full-time math teacher and a football and baseball coach. I have never regretted that decision. Everyday is still new and exciting for me. As I move into this new job I am very excited about the opportunity to work in and for this community. The people here have been wonderful and very helpful in helping me get established in BHUSD.

Of the approximately 1,400 students at

settled in this position, so I might be a little off with that number. I'm pretty sure it's around 40 percent, though.


Has lower enrollment affected filling the teams?

There's a direct correlation. Any time you lose students, you'll also lose student athletes, simply because there will be less students overall. Our plan right now, as far as filling the teams goes, is that we're going to really emphasize our focus on multi-sport kids. We're really encouraging our athletes to participate in multiple sports, and we're seeing a lot of willingness to do that. The kids are very involved and many of them already play more than one sports, so we're seeing success there. We want to share our athletes across all of our sports teams, particularly with enrollment numbers being down. It's important that our athletes with the ability and desire to participate as much as they can do so. Beverly's football program has struggled to win games in recent years. What is the future of the program?

Right now, we've hired Jarrod Bunch, who is a former University of Michigan player and played for the New York Giants in the National Football League. With so many people being new, we're focusing mainly on reestablishing the program right now. That's what the future looks like.

The coach that was here before has retired from teaching and coaching. We're starting fresh and trying to generate interest in the program as we fill teams and start playing games. It's not going to be easy, but I think we're going to see num-


