

Gold Lauds 'Fantastic' Year in State of the City Speech, Points to End of RSO **Controversy**

In his State of the City speech last Wednesday, Mayor Julian Gold lauded 2018 as a "fantastic year," noting the recently completed Santa Monica Boulevard

ular successes.

"Since no State of the City speech is complete without some financial figures, I will start there," Gold said. "For fiscal year 2017-2018, which ended June 30, our general fund revenues—the fund from which we pay most operational expenses-are projected to be \$262 million, a 9.5% increase over the year before. I said projected because we are still finishing the accounting. These are the unaudited expenses."

"Our property tax revenues are projected at \$70.4 million, 13.9% higher than the year before. Projected at \$49.1 million, our hotel tax revenue-known as TOT or transient occupancy tax—increased by 12.8%," the Mayor continued. "The bottom line is that revenues continue to be strong, and the fiscal state of our City is strong.'

Potentially the most surprising moment of the evening was when Mayor Gold addressed a topic that has been of particular contention in the last year-rent stabilization. The issue, which has only grown more contentious in recent weeks due to the upcoming vote on Proposition 10, will be solved by the end of the year, according to Gold.

"We recognize this has been a long and difficult process and sincerely appreciate the cooperation of all who participated," Gold said. "In an effort to bring this to conclusion, we have scheduled two City Council study sessions in October where, hopefully, we can find consensus for the outstanding issues. My goal is to have this ordinance completed by December 31."

During the meetings, which are set for Thursday, October 11 at 7:00 p.m. and Thursday, October 18 at 10:00 a.m., City Councilmembers will be presented with the final report from HR&A Advisors on



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policy issues related to the Rent Stabilization Ordinance, including feedback received from community members at the City's facilitated dialogue discussions, and the final report on Habitability Standards. Both meetings will be held in Council Chambers at City Hall.

"Change is hard and in our city, perhaps even harder because of its iconic reputation. As we look to create change, we need to ensure that we maintain the character of our city as our city. That is first and foremost," Gold said toward the end of the night as he geared up to discuss his plans for the City's future, which include finding ways to attract younger people to Beverly Hills and embracing the expansion of the Metropolitan Transportation Authority (Metro) into the area.

"Nothing wrong with older folk; look at me," Gold said. "But the younger generation brings new ideas, new energy and children, which are vital to our school system. We have to find ways to attract younger people. New and different "Millennial experiences," more activities later at night, housing which is affordable, all will contribute to this renaissance."

"We know the subway will be transformative," he continued. "It will bring not only more people but also, likely, more and different development. Let's think about what kind of housing, what kind of businesses, what kind of nightlife, arts and culture would we like to see here."

Gold concluded his speech hopefully, with a quote from President John F. Kennedy: "For time and the world do not stand still. Change is the law of life. And those who look only to the past or the present are certain to miss the future."

Board of Education to Review 'No Tests Home' Practice

The Beverly Hills Board of Education is set to discuss whether or not students in the district should be allowed to use graded tests as take-home study tools following a request from Tara Kittle, a parent of a Beverly High tenth grader.

Kittle said her son has not been allowed to bring home graded tests to review and learn from his mistakes because teachers fear students in lower grades might gain

access to exams and use them to cheat in the future.

"The simple solution to that is to make new tests. Make a few slight adjustments to numbers and then it's a new exam," Kittle told the Board at Tuesday's meeting. "We should not be punishing our current students by denying their opportunity to improve on their grades or by not allowing them to take tests home to study with family or tutors."

Kittle also defended the right of students in younger grades to take a look at the tests if they desire to do so. In her view, studying exams should not be considered cheating because it is still simply a form of studying.

"When students study previous SAT exams, they aren't cheating. It's dedicated and resourceful to study previous exams,"

she said. "When students study previous AP exams, they aren't cheating. It's a widely encouraged study tool to help students improve their scores."

Board President Lisa Korbatov agreed to agendize the item at a future meeting after noting that the issue has come before the Board in the past.

"This is always a very contentious issue with people having strong feelings about it from both sides," Korbatov said. "I would like to maybe see some research about what other districts do and decide after reviewing that whether or not we should be allowing kids to do this or not."

BHUSD Superintendent Michael Bregy said the district would conduct research on the subject, but noted that not allowing students to take tests home to use as study materials is not a district policy, as Kittle originally said, but was instead a practice that some teachers implement in their classrooms.

"I do want to maybe just note that this isn't a district policy. It's something some teachers do and that some don't. We'd definitely be happy to look into it and do some research on the subject. That's the kind of thing we love to do," Bregy said.

After the meeting, Kittle told the *Week-ly* that she hoped discussing the 'no tests home' practice would lead into a wider discussion of classroom structure.

"I really think it would be great if kids were given rubrics at the beginning of the year outlining what will be expected of them so that they can determine if a class is a good fit for them," she said. "So, they could look at it and say, 'Yes, okay, I think I can write essays at this level and this is a good fit,' or, if they don't think they'll be able to handle the rigor of a class, they can choose to switch into something else, rather than see their grades impacted at the end of the year."

Snowden Inducted Into Montebello High School Hall of Fame

Former Beverly Hills Police Chief David Snowden was inducted into the Montebello High School Alumni Association and Associated Student Body Hall of Fame on September 27 after serving in law enforcement for more than 50 years.

Snowden, who is an alumnus of the school, first got involved with law enforcement in 1966 when he joined the local Montebello Police Department. Six

years later, he was promoted to Sergeant. In 1977, he joined the Baldwin Park Police Department at the rank of Captain, bypassing the rank of Lieutenant. In the years since, he has been the Chief of Police for the Baldwin Park, Costa Mesa and Beverly Hills Police Departments.

Also a veteran of the United States Army, Snowden attained the rank of Colonel. In 2002, he was given the honorary rank of Brigadier General in the Reserve.

In addition to his work in law enforcement, Snowden has worked with many professional groups and organizations including the California League of Cities, where he served on the Board of Directors, and the Hoag Hospital Board of Directors in Newport Beach.

Snowden retired from the City of Beverly Hills in June 2015.

USC Shoah Foundation Video on Antisemitism Opens UNESCO Panel at United Nations General Assembly

Beverly Hills resident and Managing Director of the University of Southern California Shoah Foundation Kim Simon recently presented a film featuring video testimonies on current antisemitism entitled, "The Power of Education for Countering Racism and Discrimination: The

Case of Anti-Semitism," at the 73rd Session of the United Nations General Assembly.

The high-level panel to which the video was presented, organized by the United Nations Educational, Scientific, and Cul-

tural Organization (UNESCO), featured United Nations Secretary-General Antonio Guterres and Director-General of UNESCO Audrey Azoulay, as well as various ministers and high-level officials from many countries.

The main objectives of the event were to mobilize national governments and education stakeholders to address racism and discrimination, including antisemitism, through education and to further international collaboration with UNESCO and the United Nations on relevant initiatives.

"Jews continue to be attacked for no other reason than their identity. And antisemitism is not a problem for the Jewish community alone. Where there is antisemitism, there are likely to be other discriminatory ideologies and forms of bias feeding each other in a cauldron of contempt," Guterres said at the meeting.

The speakers highlighted the importance of combating racism and discrimination on a global scale, with a focus on antisemitism, as part of the overall effort to prevent and counter violent extremism.

"We were honored to present our work to this high-level panel and hope this testimony educates and informs their decisions moving forward," said USC Shoah Foundation Finci-Viterbi Executive Director Stephen Smith, who holds the UNESCO Chair on Genocide Education. "While antisemitism dehumanizes all of us, testimony can elevate our ability to empathize and inspire us to action."

Parent-Organized Ed Talks Kick Off with Kramer

Nationally recognized artist Aaron Kramer spoke to students at Beverly Vista on Wednesday as part of a new monthly lecture series organized by parent Pantea Shakib.

Shakib, who also organizes a weekly fort-building exercise for BV students, said the monthly series was and will continue to be offered free of charge. It also provides an opportunity for eighth grade students to get community service credits. More importantly to Shakib, however, is the advice speakers will give to the students.

"We'll be bringing speakers in from diverse backgrounds and career tracks,"

Shakib said. "They'll talk to the students about things they have gone through, the paths they took to end up where they are in their careers and will give them advice about how to face challenges that come up as you're building a career."

Kramer, who spoke at the firsts 'Ed Talk,' as Shakib has dubbed the lecture series, talked to the students about creating art through the use of reclaimed and recycled materials, centering the discussion around the mot-

to that he said has defined his artistic career: "Trash is the failure of imagination."

Described by Shakib as an "active Tinkerer," he is known for the work he did to establish the Tinkering School LA through reDiscover and for teaching private workshops for kids on how to turn objects they find around the house or in the recycling bin into art

Shakib said between 40 and 70 students showed up for the first talk, a number she is hopeful will continue to grow in the coming months.

"This is something we're going to do every month," Shakib said. "It's only going to keep getting better and better every time, so I hope we continue to see kids coming to the events that are excited about being there. That's how you know something is really working for them."

Richards Presents Argument Before California Supreme Court

Beverly Hills attorney Ronald Richards celebrated a career milestone this week when he argued the first of two oral arguments he will present before the California Supreme Court this term.

"There's essentially a four percent chance that you can get your matter called

before the Supreme Court out of all the petitions they receive," Richards the told Weekly. " Many lawyers in their whole career never get to take an ar-

gument before their state Supreme Court. I can't believe I have two in the same year."

The case Richards brought before the Court, 'Dr. Leevil, LLC v. Westlake

Health Care Center,' is related to action brought against a commercial tenant for unlawful detainer by a purchaser of property at a foreclosure sale. According to Richards, the case advanced to the Court after a disagreement in appellate court.

"There was a conflict that arose over an appellate court decision and the Supreme Court stepped in because they wanted to resolve the issue," he said. "So, basically, we got picked because

they wanted to give a final say on the matter. The case is of statewide importance as it relates to the timing of when you buy a property at auction and when you can move to evict an occupant of that property."

Peter Garland Restaurateur, Porta Via Beverly Hills Palisades Location to Mirror Canon Drive Classic

Peter Garland, who first opened Porta Via on Canon Drive in 1994, expanded his business on September 22 to include a Porta Via location at the new Palisades Village project. Last Thursday. he spoke with the Weekly about how the restaurant industry has changed through his 24 years in the business and how the new location will differ from the Beverly Hills fixture.

Porta Via has been a fixture on Canon Drive for over 20 years. What made you want to open a second location in the Palisades?

Part of it was customer demand. Rick Caruso, who is the developer of the Grove and the Americana and several other shopping areas, approached me about opening a Porta Via in the new Palisades Village. After I took a drive out there and looked at the development I fell in love with it. I certainly felt the neighborhood was simply underserved. Before he did the development there, there was really a lack of choice in the neighborhood for places to eat. I thought Porta Via would be a great fit and it has been so far. I think we bring something to the community that is really appreciated and that wasn't here before.

How will the Palisades restaurant differ from the original Porta Via on **Canon Drive?**

The menu will be very similar. Right now, we're only serving lunch and dinner .We hope to be open soon for break-

fast and brunch. In terms of differences, the wine program is different at the Palisades. We've done some neat things with it, including running wines from a tap system. That's been kind of fun for

Will Ryan Hill, who is a familiar face at the Beverly Hills location, be involved with the Palisades location?

Ryan has been a fixture at the Beverly Hills restaurant for the last 15 years. He is at the Palisades now, heading up that location. We're lucky to have him there. He'll be heading up the cocktail program there, which is a program that is very popular in Beverly Hills. We'll be doing Batch Spirits at both locations. You've talked a lot in interviews about keeping your restaurants local. How will you accomplish that in the new location?

We started that campaign prior to construction. We are a sponsor of the local high school football team. About a month ago, in August, we headed up a fundraiser to raise money for their program. We worked with some other groups to raise \$10,000 in total for that program. We are also involved with the local Palisades Fire Department and the KI Temple in the Palisades.

During the summer, there was a program called Movies in the Park that ran for four consecutive Saturdays. The movies were free, and we were sponsors of that event. It was really worthwhile to

do that. We got to meet a lot of neighbors. Those are the big things we've done thus far, but we are also members of the Chamber of Commerce. I was actually just asked to sit on the board of directors of the Chamber and I accepted that position.

How has the restaurant industry changed since you first opened Porta Via in Beverly Hills?

That's a great question. The industry

has changed a lot. Certainly the rising costs of doing business have affected restaurants across our region. The amount of good restaurants that are currently serving communities from the beach to East LA has made finding good personnel more challenging. Delivery services like Postmates and GrubHub have kept people comfortable in their homes in a way that sometimes keeps them from going out, so all of those things have affected business. The Palisades location marks the first expansion of Porta Via. What made you decide to expand now, after 24



METRO BATTLE HEATS UP AS STUDENT ACTIVISTS PLAN DISTRICT-WIDE WALKOUT

Superintendent Pushes for Federal Government Involvement

Student activists at Beverly High officially announced October 12 as the set date for their upcoming, district-wide school walkout this week, after first mentioning the planned protest at a student-organized community forum on September 24. Students will begin leaving classrooms at 10:30 a.m. to head toward Beverly Gardens Park.

The walkout is the latest strategy the district has taken in fighting Section II of the Metropolitan Transportation Authority's (Metro's) Purple Line Extension project. The extension is set to run

Quality Management District (AQMD) cancer risk thresholds.

"We never believed that there was a danger. I don't sit on the MTA Board now, so I can't speak for Metro, but I still don't believe there is a danger or any kind of jeopardy associated with tunneling there," Former County Supervisor Zev Yaroslavsky, who previously worked on the extension project as a member of the MTA Board, told the Weekly in an exclusive interview. "We tunnel under buildings all over the world and have done so at other schools in Los Angeles."



beneath the school's campus following construction, something the district has said could lead to increased cancer risk and other health problems in those who work and attend school there.

BHUSD has also expressed concern over the construction staging areas that will be in place at the school for the next seven years. These staging areas are within 50 feet of the high school's portable classrooms, which the district claims could cause students to experience coughing, dizziness, nausea, headaches, chronic asthma and other respiratory illnesses due to airborne toxins entering the air as the tunnel is built.

Metro has categorically denied that the project would jeopardize the health or welfare of the public and has stated that the expansion would not exceed Air Previous attempts to halt the project include more than \$17 million in lawsuits, outreach to local and state representatives and a petition signed by more than 1,450 community members requesting that President Donald Trump and U.S. Transportation Secretary Elaine Chao step in to stop the extension. In an email dated October 2, Superintendent Michael Bregy urged BHUSD staff, parents and community members to continue to push for a resolution at the national level.

"For the very first time, we have the attention from outside of the courtroom and at the national level. Members of Trump's Cabinet and the national news agencies are aware of our situation, and now we need your help to achieve the win-win compromise we have been seeking," Bregy wrote. "We will only see

a resolution from the national level. They are listening and WE need your support!"

Bregy could be correct in his belief that only federal action could halt the project at this point.

Both Yaroslavsky and LA Metro Communications Manager Dave Sotero have stated they do not feel the project could be moved after so much work, time, money and effort have been put forth.

"We see no feasible and prudent alter-

native alignment to connect to the Century City Constellation Station that would avoid tunneling beneath Beverly Hills High School. It is not feasible or prudent to relocate the Century City Station to Santa Monica Boulevard due to seismic risks," Sotero said. "Metro has undertaken all possible planning and will implement all feasible mitigation measures to avoid impacting the high school campus during construction."

Even so, student leaders Sean Toobi and Ryan Abrishami, who organized the protest with assistance from Bregy, want to fight for the alignment to be repositioned.

At the September

24 forum, they told attendees that Metro could instead tunnel beneath the school's football field or switch the route to Santa Monica. According to Toobi, these are a few of the alternative students are hoping for as they begin their protests.

"I am not against Metro," Toobi said at the forum. "All we are asking is that this does not go under our school. It isn't safe for us and as students, our safety is our biggest concern."

According to Yaroslavsky, options for moving the tunnel from underneath the high school were discussed previously and a settlement that would have moved the subway line south of the school's main building, with no buildings above it, was turned down by the district.

"There would have been no buildings on top, so the Board would have been able to rationalize the settlement by saying it wouldn't go under any school buildings. They would have saved millions of dollars, but they couldn't get the votes," Yaroslavsky said.

"This all started because of one school board member who had so intimidated her colleagues and the City that to even speak about this issue rationally was considered disloyal. So, people kept their mouths shut and let the money be spent," he continued. "This isn't an unpopular project in Beverly Hills. The majority of

people there supported it in the beginning and continue to support it now. The loud voices are just the ones that tend to get attention, and the price for that has landed in the pockets of the taxpayers, whose money is being spent on Washington lobbyists and Orange County lawyers."

The walkout itself, which originally began as a way for students to voice concern over the subway extension, has since morphed into a community-wide

- event that both Toobi and Abrishami hope will draw the attention of national news media and, potentially, force Metro to change the project's direction.

"We're doing a lot, we're organizing and planning every day, and I promise you that if you get involved we can stop this," Abrishami said at the forum. "Having large groups of people stand in front of a cause leads to change. Large groups of peoplenot Congressmen, not Senators, not Presidents. It's people who make change."

Bregy's emailed remarks echoed the students' invitation and asked that those who wanted to get involved with fighting the project in other

ways reach out to one of the district's five school principals.

"In addition to joining the Walk-Out, if you are a community member and/or a parent/guardian of student(s) at the high school, Beverly Vista, El Rodeo, Hawthorne or Horace Mann and are interested in assisting these efforts, please contact your school principal as soon as possible to share your support," he wrote.

When asked whether or not he felt the student walkout would impact Metro's decision regarding the alignment, Yaroslavsky said he did not think it would, as he believes the students have been given false information.

"They're feeding them false information. They're telling them terrorists might try to bomb the place and that they'll get diseases or cancer, and it just simply isn't true. It's absurd," he said. "They're teaching them to be hysterical, not to be socially active. This is fabricated information that at least one member of the School Board is using solely to solidify her campaign and I think that's horrible. Teaching children facts don't matter is horrible. It's Trumpian in its characteristics because they're saying proof isn't proof. It's 'alternative facts.' All of this language can be applied to the public relations campaign they're pulling students into."



BHUSD, BHEA REACH TENTATIVE AGREEMENT **ELIMINATING SALARY FORMULA**

After months of heated negotiations related to the salary formula for teachers and staff in the Beverly Hills Unified School District, BHUSD and its teachers union, the Beverly Hills Education Association (BHEA), came to a tentative agreement on Thursday, September 27 that eliminates the salary formula in favor of compounded salary increases and additional health benefits.

According to the summary provided by BHEA, the salary formula was specifically exchanged for a compounded increase of 15.2 percent to the base salary schedule implemented over a period of three years with a one-time, off-scheduled bonus of 0.54 percent added to staff's 2019-2020 base salary and for a compounded increase of 15.2 percent to the certificated hourly rate,

also to be implemented over a period of three years.

Under this deal, teachers and staff will see salary increases of nearly 5 percent each year, retroactive to July 1. These raises appear to match previous salary increases for teachers in the district, based on numbers provided by BHUSD Superintendent Michael Bregy.

Over the last four years, salary increases have been as follows: a 5.6 percent raise in 2014-15, a 3.4 percent raise in 2015-16, a 4.194 percent raise in 2016-17 and a 2.174 percent raise in 2017-18, Bregy said. .

The negotiated deal also calls for an





"Both the members of BHEA's Bargaining Team and Executive Board wholeheartedly support this agreement," Smith said. "Although it ends the salary formula, we feel it is an excellent package for our members and is the best consensus that could have been achieved."

Smith also noted that work-to-rule action, a union-recommended tactic that encourages teachers to pause outside-of-work activities like writing college recommendation letter and after-school tutoring, is over at this time.

"We believe the agreement reflects a compromise from BHEA and the district," Bregy said, echoing Smith's comments. "It is important to remain competitive to attract and retain our top talent in the District. Neither 'side' is getting exactly what they wanted. Compromises were made and very positive discussions and conversations took place. There is no doubt in my mind that each person involved wants the very best for our students and the future of our school district."



Dear Beverly Hills Neighbors:

On November 6, California voters will be introduced to Proposition 10, a Local Rent Control Initiative, which if passes, will greatly affect our community - property owners and tenants alike.

A "yes" vote supports allowing local governments to adopt rent control and repeal the Costa-Hawkins Rental Housing Act. Costa-Hawkins is a state statute that limits the use of rent control in California. Costa-Hawkins provides that cities cannot enforce rent control on housing first occupied after February 1, 1995, and single family housing units, (meaning residential homes, as well as condominiums, and townhouses). Costa-Hawkins also allows that landlords have a right to increase rent prices to market rates when a tenant moves out.

A "no" vote opposes the initiative and keeps the Costa-Hawkins Rental Housing Act in place, while continuing to prohibit local governments from enacting rent control on certain buildings.

If you are a landlord of a privately owned home, condominium, or townhouse, you DO NOT want Prop 10 to pass. Can you imagine if local government regulated how much you could ask for rent from a new tenant? Many people I know are already getting less than market rents for their property rentals. Prop 10 will also allow government to regulate how much you can charge to rent out a single room or guest house in your home. Should California pass Prop 10, by voting "yes" on the ballot this November, landlords will not be able to ask for market rents once tenants move out. You will be stuck with the same rent your last tenant was paying.

As a real estate agent and someone who is exposed to rentals daily, I understand that rents are high. However, I do not believe Proposition 10 is the answer to the problem of high rents, because it provides NO SOLUTION, NO PLAN TO CREATE *AFFORDABLE* HOUSING, and will potentially REDUCE HOME VALUES. I know that Californians can come together to find a better, more suitable solution that is not Prop 10.
