




Council Discusses Urban Forest Management Plan

A previously approved Urban Forest Management Plan (UFMP) appeared before the Council on December 17 to go over the chapter pertaining to wildfire hazards.

The UFMP considers goals, policies and programs that address the entire urban forest--both public and private trees. It also provides a detailed evaluation of tree-related wildfire hazards, categorized into two main phases: wildfire hazard mitigation and preparation of services like outreach meetings, assessment of street tree inventory and the development of annual work plans.

To support the goal of reducing tree-related fire hazard potential in the City's "Very High Fire Hazard Severity Zone," staff has suggested the following action items: removing all topped pine trees along Carla Ridge with less than a "good" condition rating, evaluating the effects of the planned water main projects on adjacent street trees,

increasing inspections and maintenance of trees along evacuation corridors, developing a short-term tree management plan and long-range plan to remove and replace trees over 15 years, and monitoring the wildland urban interface to reduce potential land plan reviews and fuel modification practices.

According to Urban Forest Manager Ken Pfalzgraf, any tree can ignite and burn under the right conditions, but that certain trees under some conditions are more flammable than others because of their "leaf and crown form, litter accumulation, resinous exudate, and terpenes."

The tree types of greatest concern include pines, palms eucalyptus, cypress, cedar and juniper which are found concentrated along Coldwater Canyon Road, within Trousdale Estates on Loma Vista Drive and Carla Ridge, along Doheny Road, Lexington Road, southern Benedict Canyon Drive and Greystone Mansion.

Over the past couple months, however, residents have expressed concern specifically for the Carla Ridge and Loma Vista areas of the City, stating that some of the individual trees in that area are particularly "dangerous."

Vice Mayor Lester Friedman applauded these residents for exhibiting such persistence and encouraged the Council to instead work on a "tree-by-tree basis."

"I think the fact that they've come here repeatedly about this issue, and that it has not moved forward as quickly as I think it should have, is an indication to all of us that something needs to be done more quickly than we have been going forward," said Friedman.

The Council ultimately agreed that the presentation given by staff was a "good outline," but that the more severely damaged trees would be prioritized first, rather than the initial proposal of starting at one end and taking a linear approach.

Rowe Announces City Council Candidacy

Technologist Robin Rowe has announced his candidacy for the upcoming Beverly Hills City Council election.

Candidates include Lili Bosse, Julian Gold, Lori Greene Gordon and Rabbi Simchah Green.

Rowe says that should he get elected, his top priorities would include reducing traffic congestion by using AI technology, improving transportation, building green power infrastructure, prohibiting leaf blowers, helping new businesses and improving health.

A technologist by day, Rowe's work includes designing animation software used to produce major motion pictures. He's also worked as the Former Fortune 500 chief technologist and enterprise manager, AI research lab director, DARPA PI, and a navy research scientist.

Rowe has lived in Beverly Hills since 2004 and served on the City's Technology Committee since 2016.

"Important city decisions hinge on understanding technology, which is changing rapidly. While it's great that we have a City Council advisory committee that meets to discuss technology solutions, it isn't enough. Beverly Hills needs a technologist in the room, on the Council," said Rowe.

The election is March 3.

The community sing along is part of Mirisch's initiative "to promote arts and culture" in the City.



Architectural Commission Approves Guess Barricade Design

Although City retailer Guess received a green light from the Architectural Commission earlier this year to proceed with a facade removal and sign accommodation, the applicant reappeared before the commission on December 18 to request a construction barricade graphic.

The temporary barricade includes a brand-specific graphic incorporating the brand's latest campaign, two business identification signs, and adjacent tenant names on the returns or either side of the construc-

tion barricade.

During discussion, the Commission discussed playing around with different colors and designs so as to increase curb appeal.

Vice Chair Sheri Hirschfeld pointed out that the construction barricade is indeed temporary, which should allow for some leniency.

"Maybe it's not an image we're loving for the brand, but if they would adhere to the condition in light of that, we could just roll with it," said Hirschfeld.

The commission conditionally approved the request, instructing the retailer to tone down the graphic, increase the resolution, and make the signage more readable.

Strategic Planning Committee Talks Art & Culture

At a meeting on December 9 the Strategic Planning Committee discussed Arts & Culture in the southeast area of the City.

Attendees shared thoughts and opinions regarding how to best improve the area, some of which included implementing more neighborhood-serving uses and activity spaces.

Councilmember Julian Gold, who chaired the meeting, supported the notion of creating a "flex space" that could hold both events as well as classes on different days.

"That's something to think about--going too far in one direction or the other," said Senior Planner Timmi Tway. "Where is the balance for us of an exciting district that is still respectful of residential needs? You want a holistic community, so there's a balance there and we have to think about what we want that balance to be."

Residents expressed interest in the idea of creating flex spaces, even though doing so could potentially require lowering the City's parking requirements for such areas.

Tway pointed out that the current code is "very strict" wherein businesses need to define precisely what their space is intended for so that the City can determine exactly how much parking it needs and what its unique regulations are.

Architectural Commission Chair Sharon Persovski said that while she supports the generating of ideas, the committee must soon begin "visualizing" how they would actually be implemented.

"The next step is to actually start visualizing where exactly we have the opportunity to develop what we're talking about. We're talking about [implementing] three galleries, but maybe we only have the space to develop two," said Persovski.

The next Strategic Planning Meeting is scheduled for January 13.


Stevens Receives Kindness Award

Beverly High boys' basketball coach Jarvis Turner credited his team's 80-61 victory over Palisades in an intersectional game Dec. 21 at the Swim-Gym to its defense.

"We came out and played an aggressive style of man-to-man," Turner said. "Our on-the-ball defense is a kind of a staple for

"The way our guys ... came out with their aggressiveness and that focus ... set the tone for the entire game," Turner said.

Complete scoring totals were not available. Aaron Liberty led five Beverly Hills players in double figures, Nick Andrews and Ben Ramirez "both had 20-plus games" and Williams added 16 off the bench, Turner said.

"Guys made shots but also made smart decisions which led to easy layups and high-percentage shots," Turner said. "We did a great of sharing the ball."

The Knights entered the game with a 12-1 record.




