Community Protest Grows Over BHUSD's Handling of Media Teacher's Suspension

The Board of Education faced intense criticism at Tuesday's meeting as students, parents, and community members voiced concern over the suspension of media teacher Romeo Carrey. Accusations of misconduct, lack of transparency, and administrative overreach were said during the public comments session.

Carey has been on administrative leave for two months following the airing of a student-produced segment that criticized the behavior of a district administrator. Shortly after the segment was broadcast, Carey was placed on leave, sparking concerns over censorship and student press freedoms.

Supporters have since rallied behind him, accusing the administration of unfair treatment and advocating for his reinstatement. At the board meeting, multiple speakers alleged that the investigation into Carrey was biased and driven by personal agendas rather than legitimate concerns.

The district was accused of conducting an unfounded and intimidating investigation, allegedly asking students inappropriate questions about Carey without any complaints or allegations against him. The district was accused of smearing Carey, including insinuations about hidden cameras.

Speakers alleged misconduct, including biased investigations, censorship, harassment, and intimidation of students and parents. Concerns were raised about due process violations, lack of transparency, and the consolidation of power by the administration.

Some students claimed that Matthew Horvath, the Assistant Superintendent of Personnel Services, questioned female students in private meetings to twist stories and make "outrageous accusations that have absolutely no basis in reality," including "asking female students if Carey has ever forced [them] to undress."

"Last night, I stood before the Board of Education to address the deeply flawed and unjust investigation that led to the suspension of Romeo Carey, an investigation driven by one man's bias, personal animus, and unchecked authority of the BHUSD administration. For too long, judgment, prosecution, and execution have rested in a single set of hands, with no oversight, no transparency, and, most disturbingly, secretive interviews with minor students conducted without parental consent," parent spokesperson Robbie Curtis said.

As of press time, a petition calling for Carey's reinstatement has gathered 864 signatures.

Executive Director of Communications Rebecca Starkins did not respond

to the *Weekly's* request for comment by press time.

City Council to Split Vice Mayorship

During a February 5 Special Study Session, the Council agreed to split the vice mayorship for the 2025-2026 term. This compromise, suggested by Councilmember John Mirisch and supported by Councilmember Craig Corman, allows each to serve six months in the role.

The Beverly Hills City Council is in the process of updating its City Council Policy Manual, last revised in 2009, to address inconsistencies stemming from changes in state election laws.

Historically, from 1997 to 2017, City Council elections were held in March of odd-numbered years, with new Councilmembers installed later that same month. The mayor and vice mayor were elected annually in March. However, the passage of Senate Bill 415 in 2015 required cities to align municipal elections with statewide elections, shifting them to even-numbered years.

Further modifications occurred in 2020 with the passage of SB 970, which established the following election cycle:

- •March in presidential election years (e.g., 2020, 2024, 2028)
- •June in non-presidential election years (e.g., 2022, 2026, 2030)

Currently, the installation of the mayor and vice mayor takes place in April each year, regardless of municipal election dates. In presidential election years, two new Councilmembers are elected in March and installed in April alongside the mayor and vice mayor. In non-presidential election years, three Councilmembers are elected in June and installed in July, creating a scenario where two separate installation ceremonies occur in the same year.

A concern is the possibility that a Councilmember elected in June of a non-presidential election year could serve as mayor or vice mayor for only three months, April to July, before their term ends.

Another key concern remains whether a councilmember with the third-highest number of votes should be skipped in the rotation for mayor. While nothing was reached on that issue, the Council plans to continue discussions while maintaining the current system for now.

Mirisch has indicated to the Weekly that he is waiting to get clarification on whether term limits can be applied retroactively before making any decisions on running for reelection.

The Council intends to revisit these concerns in future discussions.

Beverly Hills Considers Mexican Fan Palm Trees as Replacement for Ficus on South Santa Monica Boulevard

The Public Works Commission is set to review a recommendation at its Thursday meeting to replace vacant tree sites and declining Ficus trees on the 9800-9900 blocks of South Santa Moni-

ca Boulevard with 14-foot-tall Mexican Fan Palm trees.

The recommendation, which will be presented at the February 13 commission meeting, follows a history of infrastructure damage caused by the invasive root systems of the existing Ficus trees, according to a city staff report.

The issue of Ficus tree removal and replacement has been ongoing in Beverly Hills since the adoption of the Phase II Street Tree Master Plan in 1999. Over the years, the city has removed Ficus trees from multiple streets due to their aggressive roots, which cause damage to sidewalks, roads, and private properties, according to the report.

On South Santa Monica Boulevard, approximately 45% of the original 40 Ficus trees have been lost due to infrastructure conflicts. Currently, 18 tree sites on the street remain vacant, necessitating a decision on their replacement. The continued removal of Ficus trees will be necessary as further infrastructure repairs require root cutting, leading to destabilization and decline.

The recommendation follows a review by the Public Works Street Tree Master Plan Ad Hoc committee and a Commission discussion on November 14.

Several factors were considered when determining the best replacement tree, including:

- •Suitability for narrow parkway spaces and urban settings
- •Performance in similar climates within Beverly Hills
- •Low potential for allergen concerns
- •Drought tolerance
- •Minimal maintenance costs and reduced impact on infrastructure

While Mexican Fan Palm trees do not significantly contribute to the city's tree canopy, they were found to be the most viable option for the limited growth space. They have been successfully used as replacements on South Santa Monica Boulevard between Wilshire Boulevard and North Rexford Drive, as well as in

alternating plantings on Robertson Boulevard.

If the Commission supports the recommendation, an informational report will be presented to the City Council for final consideration.

City Council to Hear Appeal on Proposed 15-Story Residential Project

The Beverly Hills City Council is set to hold a public hearing on Tuesday, March 4, to consider an appeal regarding the proposed construction of a 15-story residential building at 140 South Camden Drive.

The appeal, filed by Wilshire Camden LLC, challenges a determination on October 3, 2024, that the project application was incomplete.

The proposed development consists of a 194-foot-tall residential building featuring 27 dwelling units, six of which are designated for lower-income households. The plan also includes a four-level subterranean parking structure with 44 automated parking spaces.

Wilshire Camden LLC has submitted the application under the "Builder's Remedy" provision, relying on the Housing Accountability Act, as well as a preliminary application.

City staff determined that the project application was incomplete as of October 3, 2024, citing missing or insufficient information required for formal review.

Public Works Commission Considers Replacement Trees for Willaman Drive

The Public Works Commission is expected to consider a proposal at its Thursday meeting to ballot property owners on Willaman Drive regarding the selection of a replacement tree for the Red Ironbark Eucalyptus (Eucalyptus sideroxylon) trees currently lining the street. This follows concerns raised by residents regarding the poor performance of the existing trees.

At the November 2024 Commission meeting, staff reviewed the history of the Red Ironbark trees on Willaman Drive. Installed in 1997, these trees have struggled to thrive, facing challenges such as insect infestations and excessive sap leakage, which have negatively impacted residents' quality of life, according to a city staff report. Following these discussions, the commission supported the recommendation to develop a Street Tree Master Plan phase for the street, including the identification of potential replacement tree species.

As part of this process, an "On the Street" meeting was held on January 19, allowing residents to discuss concerns and evaluate alternative tree options firsthand. The meeting was attended by 18 residents representing 15 addresses, accounting for approximately 20% of the 75 total addresses on Willaman Drive

During the meeting, staff and Public Works Commission ad hoc committee members led a discussion on the original 1996 selection of the Red Ironbark

tree. Apart from one attendee who supported keeping the Eucalyptus trees, most participants agreed that the trees had not performed well and were not a sustainable long-term option for the street.

City arborists presented three tree species as potential replacements, each selected based on the criteria for urban forestry, including adaptability to limited grow space, performance in Beverly Hills' climate, drought resistance, and maintenance considerations.

The proposed options were:

•Australian Willow (Geijera parviflora) – An evergreen tree with a strong track record in similar urban settings.

Crape Myrtle (Lagerstroemia indica)
A deciduous flowering tree known for its aesthetic appeal.

•Holly Oak (Quercus ilex) – A hardy evergreen tree with a dense canopy.

Attendees had the opportunity to inspect live samples of these trees and review informational materials. The general consensus at the close of the meeting favored the Crape Myrtle as the preferred replacement, though an alternating planting of the Crape Myrtle and an evergreen tree was also suggested, according to a city staff report.

Since the January 19 meeting, additional community feedback has been received and is expected to be discussed at the Public Works Commission meeting.

Once at least 51% of the street's addresses respond to the ballot, staff will return to the commission to seek approval for the selected tree type and planting theme.

Planning Commission to Review Rooftop Dining Proposal at 499 North Canon Drive

The Beverly Hills Planning Commission is set to review a proposal at its Thursday meeting for a Rooftop Dining Use Permit at 499 North Canon Drive, which would allow the construction of

tenant improvements for a future restaurant. The project seeks to establish an open-air dining space on the rooftop of an existing commercial building.

The proposal requires review by the Planning Commission as part of a pilot program.

The commercial building, constructed in 1960, currently spans 19,213 square feet across four stories and includes two levels of parking with 65 spaces. The proposed rooftop improvements would introduce a 2,765-square-foot open-air dining area with 128 seats, a 182-square-foot open-air bar, and an enclosed 270-square-foot kitchen addition. Additional enhancements include new ADA-compliant restrooms, a 9-foot-tall trellis over the dining area, 4-foot-wide perimeter planters, a new stair and exit lobby platform, and a 12-foot-tall elevator lobby.

The rooftop dining area will be designed with landscaping buffers, including 42-inch-tall planter boxes with lavender, rosemary, yellow Ixora plants, and twelve trees.

The project meets the city's zoning regulations, including height restrictions and setback requirements, according to a city staff report. The proposed enclosed structures will not exceed the permitted 15-foot height limit from the adjacent roof deck and will comply with setback angles required to minimize visibility from public streets.

As the site is near the planned Wilshire Boulevard and Reeves Drive subway station, no new parking spaces are required. However, the existing 65-space parking lot will continue to serve the property.

Crescent Drive, adjacent to City Hall, on the evening of Sunday, March 2.

As crews begin work to assemble the tent on North Crescent Drive between North Santa Monica Boulevard and South Santa Monica Boulevard, the 400 block of the street will be closed beginning Monday, February 17 at 10 p.m. to Friday, March 7, reopening by 10 p.m.

All businesses on North Crescent Drive are accessible during the closure. Motorists are urged to use alternate routes. Access remains open to local parking garages.

Additionally, on event day beginning at 3 p.m. Sunday, March 2 to 2 a.m. Monday, March 3, the following roads surrounding the North Crescent closure will be impacted. Motorists are urged to use alternate routes during that time.

North Cañon Drive between North and South Santa Monica Boulevard will be closed. Eastbound lanes on South Santa Monica Boulevard starting at Civic Center will be impacted, with lanes closed from Rexford Drive to North Cañon Drive. Detours will be in place routing traffic North and South on Rexford Drive. North Santa Monica Boulevard Eastbound lane closures will be in place from Rodeo Drive to Rexford Drive.

Planning Commission to Review Time Extension for Hotel Villa Expansion

The Beverly Hills Planning Commission is set to review a request at its Thursday meeting for a one-year extension on a Conditional Use Permit for a 1,200-square-foot expansion at The Belvedere Hotel. The proposed addition, which was originally approved in December 2023, would allow for an internal reconfiguration and the addition of a bedroom to an existing hotel villa.

The applicant has cited delays in initiating construction but anticipates beginning the project in late 2025, according to a city staff report. Under Beverly Hills Municipal Code, a Conditional Use Permit for hotels must commence construction within one year of approval or risk expiration. However, the code allows for two one-year extensions upon review by the Planning Commission.

The original approval, granted on December 14, 2023, remains unchanged, and no modifications to the project are being proposed. The commission's review will assess whether conditions or regulations have shifted since the initial approval and if granting the extension aligns with the city's zoning objectives.

If approved, the time extension would extend the project's approval through December 14, 2025, giving the applicant additional time to commence construction.

Hollywood Producer Convicted of First-Degree Murder in Fentanyl Drugging of Two Women in Beverly Hills

Los Angeles County District Attorney Nathan J. Hochman announced that David Pearce was convicted by a jury on February 4 of two counts of first-degree murdering the fentanyl overdose deaths of Christy Giles and Hilda Marcela Cabrales-Arzola in Beverly Hills in November 2021. Pearce was also convicted of rape and other sexual assaults against seven different women between 2007 and 2021.

"Today, a serial rapist was held accountable for the deaths of Christy Giles and Hilda Marcela Cabrales-Arzola, both of whom tragically died as a result of fentanyl poisoning, and the victimization of seven other women across Los Angeles," said District Attorney Hochman. "I thank the trial team, Deputy District Attorneys Catherine Mariano and Seth Carmack, for their tireless pursuit of justice and determination to give a voice to the women who bravely came forward to report the crimes committed against them. The office will prosecute to the fullest extent of the law those who illegally supply fentanyl and destroy lives, especially those who commit sexual assaults.

The jury found David Brian Pearce guilty of all charges and allegations: two counts of first-degree murder in the deaths of Christy Giles and Hilda Marcela Cabrales-Arzola; three counts of forcible rape; one count of sexual penetration by use of force; one count of sodomy by use of force; one count of rape of an unconscious woman; and one

count of sexual penetration by foreign object in the sexual assaults of seven different victims.

Pearce is scheduled to be sentenced March 13 and 148 years to life in state prison. He

will be required to register as a sex offender for life.

The jury was unable to reach a unanimous verdict on both counts of accessory after the fact in the charges against Brandt Walter Osborn.

Osborn returns to court for a pretrial hearing on March 13.

On November 13, 2021, at approximately 3 a.m., Pearce, Osborn, and Michael Ansbach, an acquaintance, met victims Giles and Cabrales-Arzola at a warehouse party in East Los Angeles. About two hours later, Giles and Cabrales-Arzola accompanied Pearce, Osborn, and Ansbach back to Pearce's Beverly Hills apartment. While at the apartment, Pearce provided Giles, Cabrales-Arzola, and Ansbach gamma-hydroxybutyrate (GHB) and fen-


tanyl, causing Giles and Cabrales-Arzola to fatally overdose.

Within about ty-five minutes of arriving at the apartment, Cabrales-Arzola called a rideshare service to leave the location, but neither Cabrales-Arzola Giles left the residence until Pearce carried Giles out of the apartment about eleven hours later and carried Cabrales-Arzola out about an hour and a half afterwards. Pearce dropped the victims off at two different local hospitals. Giles was deceased when she was dropped off at the hospital. Cabrales-Arzola was resuscitated and died eleven days later, one day short of her 27th birthday.

Upon further investigation, it was discovered that Pearce committed numerous drug-facilitated sexual assaults against multiple women. Seven victims testified at trial to Pearce's sexual depravity and violent tendencies.

"This event reflects our commitment to preparing students for success be-


yond the classroom and ensuring each day is truly a day well lived," said Principal Drew Stewart.

Builder's Remedy or Density Bonus: Pick Your Poison

We have a Hobson's Choice wrapped in a dilemma revealing a problem.

If you have been paying attention to the City's Planning Commission in recent months (and if you haven't, you should), you would have noticed a new phenomenon. Applications for multi-family structures of seven or eight story buildings in areas zoned for a maximum of three or four stories are consistently approved.

The hearings are a sham: residents make heartfelt statements about the impact on their neighborhoods, the commissioners express sympathy and then approve the applications explaining, largely but not always entirely correctly, that their hands are tied by California State law.

Now, the City Council is considering admitting that there is little discretion to deny multi-family projects with **Density Bonuses** that exceed our zoning limitations and using that now admitted baseline to reduce the size of larger projects through negotiation. If you provide affordable residential units, you have a bonus that let's you build taller and more. For example, if local zoning laws limit heights to 50', a 50% bonus might allow a building of up to 75' or taller.

On January 28, the City Council convened a Study Session to discuss the possibility of offering developers a **streamlined permit process** to incentivize a scaling back of their projects.

One real estate industry publication discussed this issue under the **premature and overly simplistic** headline: "Beverly Hills softens its stance toward Builder's Remedy projects". State law arguably prohibits local governments from enforcing **any** zoning limits during a period when their housing plans have not been certified as a Builder's Remedy.

It is important to understand why the Council would consider making it easier to get approvals for projects that, however scaled back, involve, for example, taller buildings than our zoning codes mandate.

The short answer is that the Council is **picking its poison** – faced with two unattractive alternatives, it is picking the one that it considers less bad.

The overall context is California's policy to require the construction of

large numbers of multi-family residential units that will be made available at rental rates far below market rates ("affordable") in every California county and municipality, large or small, urban or rural, densely developed or with lots of open space, affluent or not.

Personally, I consider the state's policy as misguided as it is destructive.

But it is what it is.

The proposal currently under consideration relates to fourteen so-called Builder's Remedy Projects for which Preliminary Applications were filed prior to the early May, 2024 certification of the City's Housing Element. These applications seek entitlements to build structures that are **vastly in excess of our zoning restrictions**. For example, one application seeks to construct a 20-story building at 8844 Burton Way; another seeks to construct a 19-story building at 145 S. Rodeo Drive.

Of the fourteen, four were submitted after the City adopted its later certified plan in mid-March, 2024. In my opinion, **the "window" for Builder's Remedy applications closed** at that time. I am hopeful that the City will reject the post-Mid March applications as untimely. Apart from those, there are ten projects from five or six different developers.

The California Department of Housing and Community Development ("HCD") has taken an aggressive position regarding the City's processing of applications for both Density Bonus and Builder's Remedy projects. HCD has sought to curtail the City's discretion to deny those applications even though they ignore the City's zoning laws.

It appears that the City Council is concerned that if pending Builder's Remedy applications are rejected, we will likely be facing substantial legal jeopardy if the applicants institute litigation challenging those rejections.

Further, the more that the City resists approving any of these projects, HCD may revoke its certification of our Housing Element. Such a revocation will open a new window for Builder's Remedy applications. The enactment of this expedited path to development hopefully may curb the enthusiasm of HCD to take punitive action against the City.

It is important to understand that at HCD's insistence, the City's plan requires at least that the City makes sub-

stantial progress in the next 4+ years toward the construction of at least 2,000 affordable residential units. If everyone of the 14 currently active Builder's Remedy applications is actually constructed as proposed there will be two consequences:

1) Our City will have been **dramatically**, **irrevocably altered**; and

2) A total of **only 327 affordable units** will have been constructed.

Take a moment to think about that: the character of a 110 year old city altered for only 327 affordable units and then we will be "only" 1700 affordable units short of our quota.

The Council hopes that if it can offer assurances of quick and certain approval, it will have "leverage" to persuade applicants to modify a Builder's Remedy project for 19 or 20 stories to 8 stories. If this happens, of course, the number of affordable units will be reduced to 150 or so.

Specifically, the Council is considering enacting Municipal Code provisions which, in essence, authorize the City to drop all of the administrative hearing review and environmental scrutiny and provide expedited approval of a Density Bonus project if the applicant will drop its Builder's Remedy project and comply with the limits afforded by the Density Bonus provisions.

Without express legislative authority providing that the City can offer to streamline (or eliminate) the review mandated for Density Bonus projects, it will be more complicated to negotiate the desired reductions of size of the Builder's Remedy projects.

Given that the applicants could have limited themselves to Density Bonus projects but went well beyond those limits, it is unclear whether this will be attractive.

At the January 28 study session, the Council took no action other than to refer this matter to the Planning Commission for its suggestions for implementation of this proposal. Notably, the Council did not ask the Commission whether this should be implemented; rather, only for ideas as to how it would be implemented.

Here are my thoughts.

Projects limited by the current State Density Bonus "menu" generally are preferable to our residents to the far less constrained Builder's Remedy rules. While we may not like the seven or eight story buildings in our neighborhoods, insertion of a number of twenty-story buildings is worse.

Whether the trade-off of Density Bonus standards for far more generous Builder's Remedy standards will be attractive to the applicants will be influenced by a number of factors including whether the applicant perceives that the larger project is financially viable and the applicant's resources. Presumably, circumstances of the five or six developers and the viability of the projects differ materially.

At the January 28 study session, Councilmember Corman made clear that he would not favor giving the Builder's Remedy applicants ministerial approval to do anything more than what they could do by taking advantage of the Density Bonus with more certainty and less cost.

But if that is the **starting point** of the negotiations, it is foreseeable that further concessions will be demanded by the applicants and, perhaps, agreed to.

A better course may be to keep our powder dry and leave our options open.

For now, I shall keep an open mind regarding the best course for navigating our way through a state policy which, in a word, is stupid.

Quite apart from the Density Bonus/Builder's Remedy dilemma, another very tall project has been proposed for the City. On February 7, Millennium Partners, a developer of very high end projects in major US cities, filed an application with the City for a 34-story residential tower called "The Eastern". This has been proposed for 8300 Wilshire Blvd. at the eastern border of the City, currently the site of a single-story retail center.

The proposal is for 249 residential units of which 22 will be affordable apartments, the rest condos.

Approval of this proposal will require a Specific Plan for the site, similar to the process for approval of the One Beverly Hills project (which also involves high-rise towers) on the western border of the City.

This is a serious project from a serious applicant. At this point, I am **not advocating approval of the project** but simply observing that Millennium Partners is a major, well-financed developer. Notably, its press release includes favorable comments from Chamber of Commerce Board of Directors Chair Bobbie Jo Dawson and former Mayor Willie Brien so the developer has already started gathering prominent local support.

This application is very different from the Density Bonus/Builder's Remedy projects discussed above. The applicant has no right to the entitlements that will be requested but, rather, must persuade the City to exercise its discretion to allow it to go forward. That persuasion will, predictably, involve substantial consideration to the City in addition to the revenues that it will generate in the form of taxes and fees.

While it is good to have confirmation that our little City remains attractive to high-end developers, we must take care to protect the qualities that make our City special with all available tools.

WATER WORKS

Public Works Commission Chair Mark Nehoray on Maximizing Resource Efficiency

What initially interested you in the Public Works Commission?

We've been residents since 1997, and I've always wanted to give back to the city. I looked at the various commissions, and this was the one that caught my attention. This is the one I applied for, went through the interview process, and here I am.

Are there any upcoming Public Works projects you're looking forward to?

I would say quite a few. And let me add—my highest priority, which I emphasized during my interview for the commission, is water. I believe it is scarce, and I want to make sure I pay particular attention to water and new sources of it. That includes how we manage our reservoirs and explore new water sources.

As you might

know, we have wells in the city, and about 20% of our water comes from them. We are planning to construct two new potable wells near La Cienega Park, and we hope to complete the project by 2026. Once finished, we will have a total of nine wells. These two new wells should be ready in about a year and a half. [Beyond that], we want to do more. We are looking to add another potable well and are currently studying the best location for it.

Regarding reservoirs—we have quite a few, specifically three, which store water before it is distributed. One project currently underway is the Reservoir Management System, or RMS. The best way to describe it is that it continuously mixes the water inside the reservoir to prevent it from sitting still. [Stagnant] water leads to a decline in quality, so this system helps [maintain] high water quality. By implementing the RMS, we can

> store more water while ensuring its quality. The project is already in progress to install the RMS.

Another [initiative] is the Cabrillo Reservoir, where we are in the final design phase of the new pump station. This new station will improve water distribution throughout the city, particularly to the north. Additionally, we are starting a project to replace aging potable water pipelines. Our city has about 65 miles of potable water pipelines within our service area. Since they are aging, we are beginning a replacement project this year,

starting with about two miles. Over the next year, we aim to replace another two to four miles.

These [initiatives reflect] what I hope to accomplish regarding water this year, with a long-term view of improvements over the next two to three years.

What is the status of the Sand Pit site and its potential for a potable water well location?

It is under consideration. We're still researching and studying whether it remains a viable site, so the decision hasn't been finalized yet.

Tell us about your professional career.

I'm a CPA by trade and was a tax partner with Deloitte for 28 years. I retired from Deloitte in May of 2022, and I now oversee a family office here in Beverly Hills.

It's been one year since the completion of the Burton Way Green Street and Water Efficient Landscape Project. How successful has that been with the city's water conservation goals?

I think it has met all of our expectations. We hope to have more projects like this, particularly those focused on water conservation.

We did experience a bit of a delayed start due to technology and testing challenges but it is now up and running, performing well, and we look forward to implementing more projects like it in the future

Tell us about your family.

My wife, Farah, and I have been together for 35 years. We have two daughters, [Joline and Celine, profiled in Issue #1056]—one is married, and the other is not married yet.

What do you hope to accomplish as chair?

As chair, I want to accomplish as much as we can, as quickly as we can—that is the mission. I've laid out the priorities, and my goal is to address them with a sense of urgency. One of my highest priorities is ensuring our reservoirs are full, along with completing the wells,

which we hope to finish by 2026. I want to move as quickly as possible to complete as many projects as we can over the next couple of years. While not everything will be completed this year, I aim to make [significant] progress and lay the foundation for their completion—if not this year, then next year.

Is there anything else you would like our readers to know?

One thing is in regards to sustainability and environmental initiatives. With Senate Bill 1883, the focus is on waste reduction, recycling, and organic waste programs. One key initiative is ensuring food waste is properly deposited in green bins. To achieve this, we need to continue promoting community education programs on efficient resource use, including water conservation, sustainable landscaping practices, and citywide greenhouse gas reduction efforts.

Additionally, we want to promote energy resiliency and efficiency across the city through utility incentives at the federal, state, and local levels.

I was part of [former] Mayor Julian Gold's electrical resiliency program, which I want to revive. I want to try to determine how we can make Beverly Hills more resilient when it comes to electricity. I believe we have a strong grasp on water management, but now we need to focus on improving the city's electrical reliability and resiliency.

ORDINANCE NO. 25-O-2910

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF BEVERLY HILLS AMENDING BEVERLY HILLS MUNICIPAL CODE §10-3-2745 TO MODIFY MAXIMUM ALLOWABLE FLOOR AREA RATIO LIMITATION FOR CERTAIN BUILDINGS LOCATED IN C-3 COMMERCIAL ZONES

THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BEVERLY HILLS HEREBY ORDAINS AS FOL-LOWS:

Section 1. On November 14, 2024, the Planning Commission held a duly noticed public hearing after which it adopted Resolution No. 2075, recommending that the City Council amend a portion of Title 10 (Planning and Zoning) of the Beverly Hills Municipal Code to amend the maximum allowable floor area ratio (FAR) limitation for certain buildings located in the C-3 Commercial zones to allow properties within the Business Triangle to increase the maximum floor area ratio (FAR) as a result of the conversion of the ground level of an existing parking structure abutting a pub-lic street to retail business(es), subject to the approval of a Development Plan Review and amend the City's General Plan Land Use Map accordingly to note the change in permissible density for certain buildings (collectively, the "Amendments"). On January 28, 2025, the City Council held a duly noticed public hearing, received public testimony, and thereafter introduced this Ordinance.

Section 2. This Ordinance and the Amendments, in conjunction with the proposed project located at 450 North Roxbury Drive (collectively the "Project") were assessed in accordance with the authority and criteria contained in the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA), the State CEQA Guidelines, and the environ-mental regulations of the City. The Project includes the conversion of 6,797 square-feet (SF) of existing parking spaces located on the ground floor of an existing parking structure at 450 North Roxbury Drive to retail uses. The Project has been assessed in accordance with the authority and criteria contained in the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA, Public Resources Code Sections 21000 et seq.), the State CEQA Guidelines (California Code of Regulations, Title 14, Sections 15000 et seq.), and the environmental regulations of the City. An Initial Study/Negative Declaration has been prepared to evaluate the potential environmental effects that could result from the construction and operation of the Project. The City Council adopted the Initial Study/Negative Declaration as part of its approval of the related General Plan Amendment for the Project, and concluded that the Project would not result in any significant environmental impacts and that no mitigation is necessary.

Section 3. The Amendments are consistent with the objectives, principles, and standards of the General Plan. The proposed Amendments further the goals and policies set forth in the General Plan for commercial uses located throughout the City. Specifically, they support the General Plan's goals and policies outlined in the Land Use Element and the Open Space Element to maintain and enhance the character of the City's business districts, exhibit a high level of site planning and design, promote pedestrian-active streets, accommodate diverse uses for customers that also support the needs of local residents, support and retain high-quality businesses, and ensure compliance with the City's sustainability goals.

Section 4. The City Council hereby amends §10-3-2745 of Article 27 of Chapter 3 of Title 10 of the Beverly Hills Municipal Code to read

as follows:

A. Except as may be expressly provided in this chapter, the maximum floor area ratio on any site area shall not exceed 2.0. For the purposes of this section, "site area" shall include only those portions of the site which are in a nonresidential zone, including the C-5 zone.

B. Notwithstanding subsection A, the maximum floor area ratio on a site located within the Business Triangle, as defined in Section 10-3-2703, may be increased as a result of the conversion of the ground level of an existing parking structure abutting a public street to retail business(es), as defined in Section 10-3-100, up to a depth of 70'-0" from the front property line, subject to approval of a Development Plan Review pursuant to Section 10-3-3100. The additional floor area for the conversion shall not exceed 10% of the maximum allowable floor area for the site, regardless of the existing building square footage.

Section 5. Severability. If any section, subsection, subdivision, sentence, clause, phrase, or portion of this Ordinance or the application thereof to any person or place, is for any reason held to be invalid or unconstitutional by the final decision of any court of competent jurisdiction, the remainder of this Ordinance shall be and remain in full force and effect.

Section 6. Publication. The City Clerk shall cause this Ordinance to be published at least once in a newspaper of general circulation published and circulated in the City within fifteen (15) days after its passage in accordance with Section 36933 of the Government Code, shall certify to the adoption of this Ordinance, and shall cause this Ordinance and her certification, together with proof of publication, to be entered in the Book of Ordinances of the Council of this City.

<u>Section 7.</u> Effective Date. This Ordinance shall go into effect and be in full force and effect at 12:01 a.m. on the thirty-first (31st) day after its passage.

ORDINANCE NO. 25-O-2911

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF BEVERLY HILLS AMENDING SECTIONS 2-4-201; 2-4-202; AND 2-4-203 OF THE BEVERLY HILLS MUNICIPAL CODE RELATING TO THE PREVENTION OF PRICE GOUGING AND DECLARING THE URGENCY THEREOF

THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BEVERLY HILLS HEREBY ORDAINS AS FOLLOWS:

WHEREAS, the Los Angeles County Fires and Windstorm Event of January 2025 has burned over 40,000 acres, destroyed more than 12,000 residential and commercial structures, and damaged critical infrastructure; and

WHEREAS, on January 7, 2025, the Governor of California declared a State of Emergency to exist in Los Angeles and Ventura Counties due to the Fires and Windstorm Event; and

WHEREAS, thousands of Los Angeles County residents have had their lives significantly impacted through partial or complete property loss, damage or evacuation orders, and

WHEREAS, in the wake of widespread destruction, thousands of Los Angeles County residents must now purchase a myriad of goods and services to sustain their wellbeing and to begin the long process of rebuilding their lives; and

WHEREAS, California Penal Code Section 396 makes it illegal for a person, contractor, business, or other entity to increase the price of a product or service item more than ten (10) percent for the following thirty (30) days after a proclamation of a state of emergency declared by the President of the United States or the Governor, or upon the declaration of a local emergency by an official, board, or other governing body vested with authority to make that declaration; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to California Penal Code Section 396(k), municipalities are authorized to enact local legislation prohibiting excessive and unjustified increases in the prices of essential consumer goods and services when a declared state of emergency results in abnormal disruptions of the market: and

WHEREAS, Article XI, Section 7 of the California Constitution and California Government Code Section 37100 provide the City with authority to enact local ordinances to protect the health, safety, and welfare of its residents; and Government Code Section 36937(b) also authorizes the City Council to adopt an urgency ordinance to become effective immediately upon a four-fifths (4/5) vote, when such an ordinance is necessary for the immediate preservation of public peace, health, or safety; and

WHEREAS, it is the desire of this Council to amend the price gouging article of the Municipal Code to reflect consistency with state law and to include provisions that protect against price gouging for newly rented properties; and

WHEREAS, in the interest of the public peace, health or safety, it is necessary for the City Council to exercise its authority to adopt this urgency ordinance to ensure that residents are protected from excessive and unfair price increases that could restrict access to critical supplies and services, and thereby preventing economic hardship, exploitation, and threats to public welfare.

<u>Section 1. Urgency Declaration.</u>
Based upon the recitals above, the City Council finds that this Ordinance is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health or safety. Excessive and unfair price increases on essential goods and services during a state of emergency can lead to civil unrest, can endanger public health by restricting access to critical supplies or services, and can threaten community safety by exacerbating economic instability and vulnerability. Beverly Hills' regulations have not been updated since 2007 and do not represent the latest thinking about how best to address price gouging. The City Council finds and determines that the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, or safety requires that this Ordinance be enacted as an urgency ordinance pursuant to Government Code Sections 36934 and 36937(b) and take effect immediately upon adoption. This Ordinance must be adopted and must become effective immediately in order to prevent the exploitation of victims of the Fires and Windstorm Event.

Section 2. The City Council hereby amends and restates Section 2-4-201 of the Beverly Hills Municipal Code to read as follows:

2-4-201: FINDINGS AND INTENT:

The city council hereby finds that during a state of emergency or local emergency, including, but not limited to, an earthguake, flood, fire, riot, storm, drought, plant or animal infestation or disease, pandemic or epidemic disease outbreak, or other natural or manmade disaster, some merchants have taken unfair advantage of consumers by greatly increasing prices for essential consumer goods and services. While the pricing of consumer goods and services is generally best left to the marketplace under ordinary conditions, when a Declared Emergency results in abnormal disruptions of the market, the public interest requires that excessive and unjustified increases in the prices of essential consumer goods and services be prohibited. It is the intent of the city council in enacting this article to protect citizens from excessive and unjustified increases in the prices charged during or shortly after a Declared Emergency for goods and services that are vital and necessary for the health, safety, and welfare of consumers, whether those goods and services are offered or sold in person, in stores, or online. Further, it is the intent of the city council that this article be liberally construed so that its beneficial purposes may be served.

Section 3. The City Council hereby amends and restates Section 2-4-202 of the Beverly Hills Municipal Code to include or revise the following definitions:

DECLARED EMERGENCY: The proclamation or declaration of a "local emergency" or "state of emergency" or "state of war emergency" as defined in section 2-4-102 of this chapter.

HOUSING: Any rental housing with an initial lease term of no longer than one year.

REPAIR OR RECONSTRUCTION SERVICES: Services performed by any Person who is required to be licensed under the California contractors' state license law (chapter 9 (commencing with Section 7000) of Division 3 of the California Business and Professions Code), for repairs to residential or commercial property of any type that is damaged as a result of an event that led to a Declared Emergency.

TRANSPORTATION, FREIGHT, AND STORAGE SERVICES: Any service that is performed by any company that contracts to move, store, or transport personal or business property or rents equipment for those purposes.

RENTAL PRICE:

(A) For Housing rented within one year prior to a Declared Emergency, the actual Rental Price paid by the tenant.

For Housing not rented at the time of a Declared Emergency, but rented, or offered for rent, within one year prior to the Declared Emergency, the most recent Rental Price offered before the Declared Emergency.

For Housing rented at the time of a Declared Emergency but which becomes vacant while the emergency remains in effect and which is subject to any ordinance, rule, regulation, or initiative measure adopted by any local governmental entity that establishes a maximum amount that a landlord may charge a tenant for rent, the actual Rental Price paid by the previous tenant or the amount specified in subparagraph (B), whichever is greater. This amount may be increased by 5 percent (5%) if the Housing was previously rented or offered for rent unfurnished, and it is now being offered for rent fully furnished. This amount shall not be adjusted for any other good or service, including, but not limited to, gardening or utilities currently or formerly provided in connection with the lease.

- (B) For Housing not rented and not offered for rent within one year prior to a Declared Emergency, 160 percent (160%) of the fair market rent established by the United States Department of Housing and Urban Development. This amount may be increased by 5 percent (5%) if the Housing is offered for rent fully furnished. This amount shall not be adjusted for any other good or service, including, but not limited to, gardening or utilities currently or formerly provided in connection with the lease.
- (C) Housing advertised, offered, or charged, at a daily rate at the time of a Declared Emergency, shall be subject to the Rental Price described in subparagraph (A), if the Housing continues to be advertised, offered, or charged, at a daily rate. Housing advertised, offered, or charged, on a daily basis at the time of a Declared Emergency, shall be subject to the Rental Price in subparagraph (B), if the Housing is advertised, offered, or charged, on a periodic lease agreement after the Declared Emergency.

Section 4. The City Council hereby amends and restates Section 2-4-203 of the Beverly Hills Municipal Code to read as follows:

2-4-203: PROHIBITION AGAINST EX-CESSIVE AND UNJUSTIFIED INCREAS- ES IN CONSUMER PRICES DURING A DECLARED EMERGENCY:

A. Consumer Goods And Services:

- 1. Upon a Declared Emergency, and for a period of thirty (30) days following a Declared Emergency, it is unlawful for a Person to sell or offer to sell any consumer food items or goods, goods or services used for emergency cleanup, emergency supplies, medical supplies, home heating oil, building materials, housing, Transportation, Freight, and Storage Services, or gasoline or other motor fuels for a price of more than ten percent (10%) above the price charged by that Person for those goods or services immediately prior to the Declared Emergency.
- 2. A Person may increase prices in excess of the amount permitted in subsection (A)(1) of this section if the seller or vendor can demonstrate that the increase in price is directly attributable to additional costs imposed on that Person by the supplier of the goods, or directly attributable to additional costs for labor or materials used to provide the services, provided that in those situations where the increase in price is attributable to additional costs imposed by the seller's supplier or additional costs of providing the goods or service during the Declared Emergency, the price represents no more than ten percent (10%) above the total of the cost to the seller plus the markup customarily applied by the seller for that good or service in the usual course of business immediately prior to the Declared Emergency.
- 3. A Person offering an item for sale at a reduced price immediately prior to a Declared Emergency may use the price at which it usually sells the item to calculate the price increase permitted pursuant to this subsection.
- B. Construction, Repair, And Cleanup Services:
- 1. Upon a Declared Emergency, and for a period of one hundred eighty (180) days following a Declared Emergency, it is unlawful for a Person to sell or offer to sell any Repair or Reconstruction Services or any services used in emergency cleanup for a price of more than ten percent (10%) above the price charged by that Person for those services immediately prior to the Declared Emergency.
- A Person may increase prices in excess of the amount permitted in subsection (B)(1) of this section if the Person can demonstrate that the increase in price is directly attributable to additional costs imposed on that Person by the supplier of the goods, or directly attributable to additional costs for labor or materials used to provide the services, provided that in those situations where the increase in price is attributable to the additional costs imposed by the Person's supplier or additional costs of providing the service during the Declared Emergency, the price represents no more than ten percent (10%) above the total of the cost to the Person plus the markup customarily applied by the Person for that good or service in the usual course of business immediately prior to the Declared Emergency.
- 3. A Person offering a service at a reduced price immediately prior to a Declared Emergency may use the price at which he or she usually provides the service to calculate the price increase permitted pursuant to this subsection.

C. Hotel And Motel Rates:

- 1. Upon a Declared Emergency, and for a period of thirty (30) days following a Declared Emergency, it is unlawful for an owner or operator of a hotel or motel to increase the hotel or motel's regular rates, as advertised immediately prior to the Declared Emergency, by more than ten percent (10%).
- 2. A hotel owner or operator may increase prices in excess of the amount permitted by subsection (C)(1) of this section if the owner or operator can prove that the increase in price is directly attributable to additional costs imposed on it for goods or labor used in its business, to seasonal adjustments in rates that are regularly sched-

uled, or to previously contracted rates.

- D. Rental Property Rates:
- 1. Upon a Declared Emergency, and for a period of thirty (30) days following a Declared Emergency, it is unlawful for any Person to increase the Rental Price, as defined in Section 2-4-202, advertised, offered, or charged for Housing, to an existing or prospective tenant, by more than ten percent (10%) of the regular rate, as advertised immediately prior to the Declared Emergency.
- 2. A Person may increase prices in excess of the amount permitted by subsection (D)(1) of this section if the Person can prove that the increase in price is directly attributable to additional costs for repairs or additions beyond normal maintenance that were amortized over the rental term that caused the rent to be increased greater than ten percent (10%) or that an in-

crease was contractually agreed to by the tenant prior to the Declared Emergency.

3. It shall not be a defense to a prosecution under this subdivision that an increase in Rental Price was based on the length of the rental term, the inclusion of additional goods or services, except as provided in Section 2-4-202 with respect to furniture, or that the rent was offered by, or paid by, an insurance company, or other third party, on behalf of a tenant. This subdivision does not authorize a landlord to charge a price greater than the amount authorized by a local rent control ordinance.

Section 5. Severability. If any provision of this Ordinance is held invalid by a court of competent jurisdiction, such provision shall be considered a separate, distinct and independent provision and such holding shall not affect the validity and enforceability of the other provisions of this Ordinance.

Section 6. Publication. The City Clerk shall cause this Ordinance to be published at least once in a newspaper of general circulation published and circulated in the City within fifteen (15) days after its passage in accordance with Section 36933 of the Government Code, shall certify to the adoption of this Ordinance and shall cause this Ordinance and the City Clerk's certification, together with proof of publication, to be entered in the Book of Ordinances of the Council of this City.

Section 7. Effective Date. This Ordinance is adopted as an urgency ordinance for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, or safety within the meaning of Government Code Section 36937(b), and therefore shall be passed immediately upon its introduction and shall take effect immediately upon its adoption by a minimum 4/5 vote of the City Council.

Section 8. Certification. The City Clerk shall certify to the adoption of this Ordi-

nance.


